Anti-American Attitude Increasing Among Clergy

During the course of a farewell call at the Consulate prior to his leaving for a month visit to the United States, Dom Tades, an American citizen, commented briefly on his feelings about anti-Americanism among the clergy in this area.

Now Tadeu who as just recently completed his twenty-fifth year of service in the Arason area said that in all of that time he has never experienced as strong anti-American facility prome the local elergy as he has noted in the most six months. This feeling, according to Dom Tadeu, is nothing specific and does not a pear to be directed against any particular person but to be one a general sertiment against the "mited States and American missionaries as a group. To has considered this situation to be so serious a divisive force that he has on two separate occasions offered his resimation to Dom Alberto Manos, the Archbishop of Belem. Nom Alberto, Tourver, who is very pro-American has refused both times to even consider it.

According to Dom Tadeu the amazing part of this charal auti-American C eling is that it is being fostered not by the Brazilian clergy but by the other foreign clergy working in north Brazil.
