Dear Senator Ribicoff:

Thank you for your letter of August 5, 1968 regarding an inquiry you received from Mr. Robert J. Killian, Attorney General for the State of Connecticut, concerning the status of Mr. Jose Marcial, Jr., Honorary Consul of the Dominican Republic at Hartford, Connecticut.

Although Mr. Marcial is officially recognized by the Department of State as Honorary Consul the fact that he is "Honorary" would not entitle him to special license plates. The Department of State, as a matter of policy, recommends that the various jurisdictions throughout the country issue special "foreign consul" license plates only to foreign government representatives in career status and not those in honorary status.

If I can be of further assistance in this matter please do not hesitate to let me know.

Dear Senator Ribicoff:

The last session of the Connecticut General Assembly adopted a statute, Public Act 501, which authorizes the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles to issue a special number plate bearing the words "foreign consul" for a passenger vehicle owned by a foreign consul.

The enclosed materials are copies of the appointment of Mr. Jose Marcial, Jr., as Honorary Consul of the Dominican Republic at Hartford, Connecticut. *recognize Apr. 8, 1968*

At the suggestion of your Hartford office, we are writing to ask you to inquire of the State Department as to whether or not Mr. Marcial is in fact a Consul for the Dominican Republic in Hartford. The term "Honorary" troubles us in that it indicates something different from an appointment as actual Consul.

We would appreciate it very much if you would request the appropriate office of the State Department to advise us as to Mr. Marcial's status.
