DAILY CONFERENCE SUMMARY NO. 7.

COMMITTEE NO. 1 - REORGANIZATION, COMMENCED WORK WITH OBSERVATION  
BY CHAIRMAN CARILLO FLORES THAT COMMITTEE SHOULD SEEK GENERAL  
CONSENSUS OR EVEN UNANIMITY, BECAUSE AMENDED CHARTER MUST BE  
SATISFACTORY TO ALL OR NON-RATIFICATION AMENDMENTS WOULD PRODUCE  
ABSURD SITUATION. ALREADY GENERAL AGREEMENT THAT SUPREME ORGAN

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MUST FUNCTION AND THAT FONMINS SHOULD MEET ANNUALLY. LESS  
AGREEMENT ON FORM SUCH MEETINGS AND ON QUESTIONS SUCH AS INCLUSION  
PRINCIPLES CHARTER PUNTA DEL ESTE. MENTIONED WORKING DOCUMENT  
BEING PREPARED BY INFORMAL GROUP AND COLOMBIAN DRAFT RESOLUTION  
ON NON-INTERVENTION. SUGGESTED SINGLE SUBCOMMITTEE RECONCILE  
APPROACHES TO PREPARATION AMENDMENTS, BUT AT SUGGESTION COLOMBIA  
TWO SUBCOMMITTEES ESTABLISHED: NO. 1 ON IMMEDIATE STEPS TO  
REVITALIZE OAS (ARGENTINA, COLOMBIA, ECUADOR, NICARAGUA,  
URUGUAY); NO. 2 ON CHARTER AMENDMENTS (BRAZIL, COSTA RICA, CHILE,  
HAITI, MEXICO, PERU, URUGUAY, U.S.).

CHAIRMAN TOOK PAINS MAKE CLEAR THAT NO DECISION MADE ON HANDLING  
COLOMBIAN DRAFT ON NON-INTERVENTION, THREE ONE-HALF PAGES  
LONG, WHICH REFERS IN PREAMBLE TO "UNILATERAL ARMED INTERVENTION  
IN THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC" AND REITERATES PRINCIPAL NON-  
INTERVENTION.

SUBCOMMITTEE 1 ELECTED ALFREDO VAZQUEZ CARRIZOSA (COLOMBIA) DISCUSSED CONVOCAION ANNUAL MEETING OF FONMINS WITH LEGAL WRANGLE LEADING TO REFERRAL TO WORKING GROUPS.

SUBCOMMITTEE 2 ELECTED MAURTUA OF PERU CHAIRMAN AND HEARD GUATEMALA DEFENSE ASSIGNMENT TO COAS OF PREPARATORY WORK CHARTER AMENDMENTS.

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MEETING SUSPENDED PERMIT INFORMAL GROUP PRESENT DRAFT.

COMMITTEE NO. 2, SUBCOMMITTEE 1 (ECONOMIC COOPERATION) ESTABLISHED WORKING PARTY TO DRAFT ACTA CONTAINING ECONOMIC PRINCIPLES AND PROPOSALS FOR CHARTER AMENDMENT.

SUBCOMMITTEE 2 (RIVERS AND LAKES) BEGAN DRAFTING RESOLUTION CONVOKING SPECIALIZED CONFERENCE TO STUDY MATTER AND ADOPT APPROPRIATE INSTRUMENTS. PRIMARY DIFFICULTY WAS WHETHER SPECIALIZED CONFERENCE SHOULD CONSIDER "AGRICULTURAL, INDUSTRIAL AND COMMERCIAL" USES OR WHETHER THESE ADJECTIVES SHOULD BE OMITTED, THUS BROADENING SCOPE OF CONFERENCE. (LATTER COURSE FAVORED BY ARGENTINA, BUT OPPOSED BY CHILE AND PERU. PARAGUAY AMENABLE TO ANY FORMULA ENCOMPASSING COMMERCIAL USAGES.) GENERAL CONSENSUS NOT TO SET FORTH FACTORS TO BE TAKEN INTO CONSIDERATION BY SPECIALIZED CONFERENCE.

COMMITTEE NO. 3 (PACIFIC SETTLEMENT): BRAZIL TABLED REVISED PROPOSAL FOR INTER-AMERICAN PEACE COUNCIL.

U.S. PRESENTED DRAFT RESOLUTION CALLING FOR CHOFWER AMENDMENT TO GIVE PACIFIC SETTLEMENT FUNCTIONS TO OAS COUNCIL AS OUTLINED SECRETARY RUSK'S PLENARY SPEECH. U.S. POINTED OUT ITS PROPOSAL NOT INTENDED TO SUBSTITUTE FOR PACT OF BOGOTA. U.S. ALSO CONTINUES TO SUPPORT INTER AMERICAN PEACE COMMITTEE AND AMENDMENT OF ITS STATUTES.

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BOLIVIA DRAFT RESOLUTION (DOC. 97) CONGRATULATING U.S. AND PANAMA FOR THIR EFFORTS TO SOLVE CANAL ZONE PROBLEM, AND EXPRESSING HOPE OTHER BILATERAL PROBLEMS IN HEMISPHERE WILL BE RESOLVED DIRECTLY BETWEEN INTERESTED PARTIES IN SAME SPIRIT, DREW CRITICISM FROM CHILE, ECUADOR AND PERU. DRAFT REFERRED FOR STUDY TO SUBCOMMITTEE.

GUATEMALA SUBMITTED DRAFT RESOLUTION ON BEHALF CENTRAL AMERICANS AND PANAMA ASKING GOVERNMENTS WHICH HAVE NOT RATIFIED PACT OF BOGOTA TO CONSIDER SUCH RATIFICATION.

CHAIRMAN APPOINTED SUBCOMMITTEE OF BRAZIL, U.S. URUGUAY, COLOMBIA AND MEXICO TO STUDY VARIOUS DRAFT PROPOSALS RE AGENDA ITEM III.

COMMITTEE 4 (HUMAN RIGHTS): COMMITTEE FOR MORNING MEETING OCCUPIED BY LONG PROCEDURAL DISCUSSION. CHILE, URUGUAY AND COLOMBIA WANTED RIO CONFERENCE TO APPROVE HUMAN RIGHTS CONVENTION. ECUADOR, BRAZIL, GUATEMALA, NICARAGUA, HONDURAS, BOLIVIA, ARGENTINA AND MEXICO THOUGHT IT UNREALISTIC TO EXPECT ANY CONVENTIONS COULD BE COMPLETED DURING PRESENT CONFERENCE, AND THAT STUDY WOULD BE NECESSARY BY BODY SUCH AS INTER-AMERICAN HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION.

AFTERNOON MEETING OF COMMITTEE 4 DEVOTED TO SUBJECT OF REPRESENTATIVE DEMOCRACY IN COSTA RICA INTRODUCED ITS RESOLUTION. BRAZIL EXPRESSED VIEW THAT CONSULTATION IN EVENT OF GOVERNMENTAL OVERTHROW

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SHOULD BE KEPT INFORMAL. MEXICO MADE A RESERVATION BASED ON ESTRADA DOCTRINE. URUGUAY EXPRESSED AGREEMENT IN PRINCIPLE WITH COSTA RICA PROPOSAL. U.S. SUGGESTED (1) BROADENING OF RESOLUCION TO PROVIDE FOR CONSULTATION IN EVENT OF VIOLENT OVERTHROW OF ANY GOVERNMENT; (2) CONSULTATION BE INFORMAL; (3) WILLINGNESS TO ABIDE BY INTERNATIONAL OBLIGATIONS SHOULD BE ADDED TO FACTORS CONSULTATION SHOULD TAKE INTO ACCOUNT; (4) DELETION OF LAST PARAGRAPH IN COSTA RICA RESOLUTION, WHICH WOULD RECOMMEND THAT GOVERNMENTS IN MAKING THEIR DECISIONS ON RECOGNITION SHOULD ADOPT VIEWS OF MAJORITY/DEVELOPED IN CONSULTATIVE PROCESS.

ON PROPOSAL OF COLOMBIA, WORKING GROUP FORMED, WITH COSTA RICA, URUGUAY, PERU, COLOMBIA, BRAZIL AND U.S. AS MEMBERS. WORKING GROUP MET SUBSEQUENTLY AND DEVELOPED NEW DRAFT GENERALLY ACCEPTABLE TO U.S. THIS WILL BE PRESENTED TO COMMITTEE 4 ON THURSDAY. GURDON
