The information called for in this questionnaire is required for the purpose of determining rates of education allowance, provided by section 901 (2), (iv) of the Foreign Service Act of 1946, as amended, which may be paid to eligible civilian employees of the Federal Government stationed at foreign posts. Education allowances are intended to assist such employees in minimizing financial hardship in providing for the elementary and secondary education of their children. The allowances are designed to help defray expenses at schools in foreign areas which offer an education reasonably comparable to that furnished by the free public school systems in the United States. Education allowances are not intended to meet the cost of attendance at unusually expensive types of schools.

INSTRUCTIONS

(Review the definitions in section 271.1 of the Standardized Regulations (Government Civilians, Foreign Areas) before filling in this questionnaire.)

- 1. The reply to the questionnaire should be one comprehensive report for all eligible U. S. Government civilian employees with school age children at the post (excluding ineligible employees such as resident staff employees of the Department of State). The completed questionnaire should in general reflect the educational situation at the post as it pertains to the majority of employees with school age children. Posts having no eligible children shall, nevertheless, complete a questionnaire for all grades from 1-12 for the benefit of personnel hereafter assigned. The judgment and experience of employees, and/or other Americans at the post, with children of school age should be obtained prior to completing the questionnaire.
- 2. If schools are not based on a grade system comparable to that in the public schools in the United States, specify the approximate U. S. grade equivalents used in developing answers.
- 3. Report all costs in U. S. dollars, showing in the spaces provided the exchange rate used in conversion from local currency, and the specific costs incurred in local currency.
- 4. Catalogues describing schools reported on in the questionnaire should be submitted with the questionnaire, if available. If not immediately available, but obtainable, such catalogues should be forwarded at the earliest date practicable.
- 5. If the local U. S. Government-operated school or private or public schools at a post are overcrowded, or if for other reasons admission thereto cannot be obtained, evidence of this condition should be submitted. This may be included under "Remarks" in Part II of the questionnaire or in a letter attached to the questionnaire. In such case, alternate suggestions as to schooling at institutions located away from the post should be presented in Part III of the questionnaire.
- 6. If schools located at the post are considered adequate, it would be appreciated if data on adequate boarding schools at or near the post were furnished in Part III. The Department has a continuing need for such information for use in establishing "school away from the post" allowances for other posts.
