fellow's development and, when possible, to others' understanding of international issues.

Candidates should be between the ages of 27 and 35 who are FSO's of classes 6 through 4 and their GS equivalents. Fellowships will not be awarded to support writing of dissertations or research towards the Ph.D. degree. In the event that any candidates proposed by the Department are awarded a fellowship, salary and costs incidental to the program will be borne by the Department and the Council on Foreign Relations.

Officers who are interested in the program should submit an OM to the Training Branch of the Officer Assignment and Career Management Division (PER/CMA/TRA), with a brief outline of their proposal and a statement why they wish to participate in the program. OM's should arrive in Washington no later than July 15.

An airgram announcing other elements of the Department's FY 1971 long-term training program will be sent to the field in late July or early August. Interested personnel may apply for other long-term training in FY 1971 at that time.
