Dear Minister Rowell,

Reference is made to your letter of March 25, 1964 concerning police participant training and Col. Luiz de Barros of the Paraiba State Police.

We share in the judgement you made in the case of training for Col. Barros. As you have pointed out such training is of a sensitive nature or may we add was extremely so before the recent change in the government.

May I suggest that on your next visit to Rio, you set aside at least 30 minutes and I will be most happy to brief you on all aspects of our Public Safety Program. Please advise Davis as to the time that you will be in the city and I will meet you in his office. In the meantime if my schedule permits I will come to Recife for the purpose described above.

I am enclosing a program guide relating to our participant-training program. I invite your special attention to the following:

Page 3-D - We offer no "third country training".

Page 4-II-2, and Page 9 - As of May 18, 1964 the Inter-American Police Academy (IAPA) now located at Fort Davis, Panama, will be located in Washington, D.C.

Instructions will continue in the Spanish language and all courses (except dates) and training will remain as is.

Page 7 - Much of our participant training program will center around the training outlined on this page.
