Mr. and Mrs. Gerald Woods missionaries have a Brazilian child which they have adopted. The boy is now three years old. They tell me the boy is legally adopted as far as the Brazilian law is concerned.

The Woods family will be returning to the US in August, and, of course, will take the adopted boy with them. They wish to know, in this case, what is the status of the boy in relation to his rights to immigrate to the US. Do you think there will be any problems for the boy? What would be their best approach to the situation?
