Dear Mr. Grisser:

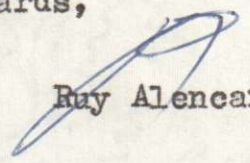
I'm writing you today to sent you the pouch and the following:

PASSPORT G 1166828 Marcos Gelfenstein is enclosed herewith, with a request for a new passaport as well as a Birth Report and Brazilian birth certificate for his son. Enclosed is \$12.00 for his new passport.

Passport K 1541916 Cheryl Lynn Fourny is also attached heretowith a Request for ammendment and her daughter's death certificate. This was a sad case, the little girl was playing the yard and got hold of an ellectrical wire and was ellectro-cutated.

This morning a James Lee Jorgenson (I'm not sure of his last name spelling) came to this Agefncy asking for a five days extension to his passport or a declation to that effect. I saw his passport and noticed a stamp saying the extension should be granted only with approval of the State Department. He said he was leaving for Colom-bia Wednesday and couldn't wait to have the passport sent to Belem for the extension. Finally, he wanted me to let him have at least the blank form which, considering his personal looks and the hippie way he dressed and acted, I said no. I told him these form have to be filled in the presence of a consular officer. Before leaving the office he told me that he had been in Belem and that you had refused him an extension.
