Dear Mr. Watson:

The following information of possible interest to the President has been received concerning the current Dominican situation.

On May 7, 1965, a report dated April 16, 1965, was received from the Immigration and Naturalization Service in which the Travel Control Section of the Honolulu, Hawaii, Immigration Office noted that a trend seemed to be developing in which Chinese transiting the United States without a visa, entering the United States at Honolulu, were destined to Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic. According to this report, for approximately the last thirty days most of the Chinese transiting the United States without a visa, had Santo Domingo as their destination. Brief interrogation revealed that they had no apparent valid reason to be so routed.

We have requested Immigration and Naturalization Headquarters to attempt to obtain full details concerning the foregoing information. Any additional pertinent data received will be promptly furnished to you.
