Memorandum of Conversation

SUBJECT: Military Officers Vious on Population Control

Without any solicitation on the part of the reporting offlear these two influential military officers energetically described their firm belief that, in order for Brazil to progress from underdeveloped status, she would have to deal rationally with the serious problem of excess population growth. They cited statistics indicating how rapid Drazil's economic and social development would be if the population greath rate was reduced to zero. They besoeved the fate of their enlisted men and less well paid officers who were burdened with far more children than they could adequately feed, clothe or educate. They criticised what they considered to be the hypocritical attitude of some middle and upper class opponents of population control the allow and even encurage their wives to use contracaptive devices while denying the poer access to such devices or even the knowledge that much devices exist.

Colonel Ely went so far as to state that, even though he had no authorization to do so, he was going to make birth control information and even pills available to his men 800m.

Comment: This is the first time the reporting efficer has heard such views expressed in such detail and with such conviction by military officers, but if there are many other high level officers who share the views expresand by Captain Branco and Colonel Ely, they may constitute a powerful lobby in favor of breaking does traditional Brasilian teboos about birth control and developing a retional population policy. It is interesting to note that the views of the Church were given no consideration whatsoever.
