Dear Mr. Watson:

The following information was orally furnished by Assistant Director C. D. DeLoach on this date to Mr. Bill Moyers, Special Assistant to the President:

A confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past learned on April 30, 1965, that Guido Grooscors, former Venezuelan Ambassador to the Dominican Republic who is now in San Juan, advised Raul Nass, Alternate Venezuelan Representative to the Organization of American States, that an individual identified only as "the Nuncio" had talked in Puerto Rico with Juan Bosch, former Dominican President, before departing for Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic. Bosch stated he had no objection to ordering a cease fire if there are guarantees of a return to a constitutional government. Grooscors said Bosch had talked with Francisco Camano Deno (rebel Dominican general) early this morning by telephone and told Camano of the above contact with "the Nuncio" and ordered Camano to contact "the Nuncio." "The Nuncio" reportedly arrived in Santo Domingo and has already contacted General Elias Wessin y Wessin, anti-rebel leader.

Camano has reportedly contacted "the Nuncio" and they are awaiting the arrival of the Organization of American States Commission which is to serve as arbitrators and which will attempt to guarantee that agreements of both "bands" will be respected.
