

What this means is that anyone who was killed, maimed, captured or imprisoned from 1969 or 1970 until the sham "peace" of October 1972 was a victim of the traitorous Nixon-Kissinger regime and the war profiteers who financed it.

Since then Admiral McMillian has been trying to break through the newswriters conspiracy of silence to tell this story to the American people.

Part of his story is how he was kidnapped on the streets of our nations capital and held incommunicado for a month in 1973 at the Bethesda Naval Hospital (where both James Forrestal and Sen. Joseph McCarthy died mysteriously, and where the autopsy of J.F.K. was botched), by agents of the Nixon-Kissinger regime, and the knowledge of a powerful southern-Senator who, two days earlier, had warned Admiral McMillian that he would do anything necessary to stop McMillian from hurting the G.O.P.'s re-election chances. The kidnappers later confessed to Admiral McMillian that Kissinger had ordered the abduction to intimidate him into silence.

High naval officers who got wind of the kidnapping finally forced Kissinger to let Admiral McMillian go, for the fear that if the officers talked, not even the newswriters monopoly could keep the truth from the public. But in releasing him, the kidnappers told him that if he ever tried to tell his story again, they would kill him or ruin his reputation, or both.

But Admiral McMillian has refused to remain silent. Repeated assassination attempts have been made on him by Kissinger agents, including a food poisoning which nearly killed him. But, undaunted, the admiral is as anxious as ever to speak out and expose the conspiracy.

The Nixon-Kissinger regime has falsified hospital records and broadcast rumors claiming that the kidnapping and the poisoned-food hospitalization were "voluntary commitments for psychiatric care" -- a tried and true Communist trick in Russia and the United States. The kidnappers have spent huge sums of money to buy people's silence, including a large contribution to the activities of a nationally known "conservative Oklahoma evangelist."

The Nixon-Kissinger regime's August 5th confession of years of lying about Watergate shatters any belief that the McMillian scandal and coverup are any less criminal than the Watergate scandal and coverup. Watergate was only a campaign prank. But the Admiral McMillian story involves the treasonable murder of soldiers in Vietnam. Watergate was simply played up to distract attention from scandals whose implications were likely to blow the Russian agent (code name Bor) Kissinger's cover.

The Nixon-Kissinger regime succeeded in unconstitutionally banning Admiral McMillian's rights to police protection in California. In effect, the police have been pressured into standing aside while assassins declare "open season" on Admiral McMillian. Only the admiral's pistol, hired bodyguard, and Administration fears of a too obvious assassination have kept the admiral alive this long.

Exposure and elimination of the police ban are the first priority. Admiral McMillian often gets as many as twenty-five threatening phone calls a day. The apparent administrator of the ban is a San Francisco FBI agent named Charles Bates. Bates has admitted to the admiral that the ban was ordered from very much "higher up."
