

Dr. Donald A. Waite, Collingswood, New Jersey, is the Associate of Dr. Carl McIntire for the 20th Century Reformation Hour broadcast. In this capacity, Dr. Waite holds radio rallies across the country, directs the activities of the McIntire radio committees, and promotes the overall program of the 20th Century Reformation Hour broadcast.

He was born in Elyria, Ohio, in 1927; graduated from Berea High School, Berea, Ohio, 1945, as salutatorian; received the Bachelor of Arts degree (A.B.) from the University of Michigan, with a major in classical Greek and Latin, in 1948; received the Master of Theology degree (Th.M.), *magna cum laude*, as valedictorian, from the Dallas Theological Seminary, with a major in New Testament Greek, in 1952; received the Master of Arts degree (M.A.) from Southern Methodist University, with a major in Speech, in 1953; received the Doctor of Theology degree (Th.D.), *cum laude*, from the Dallas Theological Seminary, with a major in Bible Exposition, in 1955; received the Doctor of Philosophy degree (Ph.D.) from Purdue University, with a major in Speech, in 1961.

Dr. Waite taught in the Southern Bible Training School for Negroes, in Dallas, Texas, during 1950-53; taught

in the Dallas Bible Institute, in Dallas, Texas, in 1952-53; taught as Professor of Speech in the Cedarville Baptist College, in Cedarville, Ohio, in 1953-54; taught, as a graduate teaching assistant in the Department of Speech in Purdue University, in Lafayette, Indiana, in 1954-56; taught, as Instructor in Speech, in the University of Maryland, Far East Extension Department, in Okinawa, in 1958; taught part time, as Visiting Professor of Speech and Debate in Shelton College, in Ringwood, New Jersey, in 1962-63; taught numerous courses for the American Red Cross, as a Water Safety Instructor, both in military service and in civilian life, from 1950 to the present; is currently a member of the Speech Association of America.

He was Interim Pastor of the Hampton Road Mexican Baptist Mission in Dallas, Texas, in 1949-50; was ordained to the Gospel Ministry on April 5, 1953, by the Berea Baptist Church, at Berea, Ohio; was commissioned a Naval Chaplain in the U.S. Naval Reserve, 1954; was given orders to active duty as a Naval Chaplain from 1956 to 1961, serving for about one year at the Marine Corps Air Station, Miami, Florida; serving for about one year with the Third Marine Division, Fleet Marine Force, on Okinawa; serving for about one year with the Military Sea Transportation Service, Atlantic
