

DURING THURSDAY'S PROCEEDINGS, DEFENSE ATTORNEY WILLIAM WALKER FILED A MOTION FOR A MISTRIAL ON THE GROUNDS THAT NEWSPAPER HEADLINES FOCUSING ON A REMARK MADE BY JUDGE CARROLL EARLIER IN THE DAY COULD POTENTIALLY INFLUENCE JURORS. WALKER FILED THE MOTION AFTER JUDGE CARROLL REFUSED TO QUERY POTENTIAL JURORS CONCERNING THEIR FAMILIARITY WITH THE HEADLINE IN QUESTION. JUDGE CARROLL IMMEDIATELY RULED AGAINST THE MOTION.

ON FRIDAY, JUDGE CARROLL ISSUED THE FOLLOWING ORDER: "IT IS ORDERED THAT THE GOVERNMENT'S MOTION IN LIMINE IS GRANTED. EVIDENCE OF INTERNATIONAL LAW SHALL BE EXCLUDED FROM THE TRIAL OF THIS CAUSE. EVIDENCE REGARDING COMPLIANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE REFUGEE ACT OF 1980, 8 U.S.C. § 1157, ET SEQ., MAY BE RELEVANT TO DEFENDANTS' GROUNDS TO BELIEVE THAT THOSE TRANSPORTED AND/OR CONCEALED HAD BEEN LEGALLY ADMITTED TO THE UNITED STATES.
