leadership of the Bahian section of the party deviate from the thoughts of Ambassador Juracy Magalhães. The former state president also said that during his period of office the party had received more contributions than at any other time and was enabled to renew its offices, carry on television programs and give greater assistance to the directorates in the interior of the state. Magalhães expressed his thanks to Governor Lomanto for the Governor's courtesy and friendliness, even though the Governor and he diverged frequently in points of view.

The convention praised the leadership of Antonio Carlos Magalhães and accepted his report by acclamation.

## COMMENT

There is little doubt that Antonio Carlos Magalhães is the outstanding figure in the local UDN organization. He gave dynamic leadership to the state UDN during his period of office, and will no doubt continue to be one of the most colorful representatives of the party in state and national affairs. There is every indication that he will be selected as the party's candidate for Governor of Bahia in the 1966 elections. He is thoroughly loyal to Juracy Magalhães, who continues to be the dominant UDN figure in Bahia. There was no indication in the convention of a rift within the state party along pro-Lacerda and pro-Juracy lines, although it is known that some party members have pro-Lacerda sympathies.

While one State Deputy, José Candido, declared his unwillingness to support the party's collaboration with the Lomanto Junior administration, the UDN is expected to remain one of the principal elements in the coalition backing Governor Lomanto in the Legislative Assembly.
