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the anticipated price reduction was effected by these shipments and that the consumer response was gratifying.

Various congratulatory messages have been sent to Governor Ney Braga by communities in Pernambuco and a visit was recently made by Antonio Barroso Cavalcanti, Commercial Director of the Bahia Company of Food, Seed and Markets to arrange for additional shipments of potatoes to that area.

In addition, it is reliably reported that Argentina desires to purchase 300,000 bags and that Paraguay has also expressed interest in buying potatoes. The official reason given for Parana's not exporting potatoes at the time is that the Brazilian Market must be served first.

Comment: The Reporting Officer believes that the export of potatoes would hurt the candidacy of Governor Ney Braga who shows every symptom of a man running for federal executive office but being coy about it. He has consistently stated that Parana and other more developed states should assist those states in need.
