Issuance Institutional Act played as major news story by principal US dailies. New York Times, Washington Post, Washington Star, Wall Street Journal, New York Herald Tribune and Baltimore Sun all front-paged lengthy accounts based on wire service or correspondent's dispatches. Flavor this coverage illustrated by Post's banner head "Brazil President Takes New Power, Bans Parties". Additional interpretative reports carried by New York Times, Washington Star, Herald Tribune, Wall Street Journal, and Baltimore Sun. Tone of this comment runs gamut from Star's O'Leary (who states action aimed at preventing possible leftist take-over) through Times de Onis (who opines that move was victory for "hard line" though it also shows that Castello and military have asserted continuing control over revolutionary movement) to Sun's Miller (who asserts "Brazil Placed Under Virtual Military Dictatorship Today").
