Effect on Municipal Finances: The Federal Government's decision in February to reduce the amount of money to municipalities under the so-called "participation fund" has adversely affected the finances of cities in Parana, according to officials with whom the reporting officer talked in Curitiba, Apucarana and Londrina. The capital, Curitiba, was not as seriously affected as other cities due to other resources available to it; however, in many municipalities, projects for installing and/or expanding water and sewage systems, paving of streets and other projects had ground to a halt for lack of funds. Some municipalities were having difficulty in paying their employees. Even the relatively wealthy cities of Apucarana and Londrina in the rich agricultural belt of northern Parana were hurt by the reduction in funds.		
8			2. Long-term Effect: While the short-term effect is to create at least temporary financial hardships, some observers saw the long-term effects as being more serious. They asserted

mat the increased money available to municipalities since 1967 under the fund had been an important factor in promoting local initiative and in changing the traditional attitude in Brazil that all initiative must come from a paternalistic national government. Thus, these observers felt that the Federal Government in reducing the funds for municipalities had removed a factor contributing toward developing local initiative in Brazil.

- 3. Secondary Economic Effect: The slowdown or halting of municipal projects and the reduction of local expenditures by municipalities was also said to be having a dampening effect on retail trade in the communities.
- 4. Comment: The adverse effect on municipal finances of the cut in the participation fund appears to have been identical in the states of Parana and Mato Grosso (see São Paulo's A-51, April 3,1969). In São Paulo, where per capita income was much larger and the relative amount of money being returned to the municipalities was less, the Government's action appears to have had very little adverse effect.
