ES-CONCOS	Article 33 of the National Security Law, which prohibits "inciting publicly" class violence, subversion of order and a variety of other subversive acts. After over a month of imprisonment, the three youths were freed in December, and at the same time, the French deacon, Guy Michel THIBAULT, was released to the custody of dom Valdir CALHEIROS, the Bishop of Volta Redonda. The Court began to take the testimony of the military men involved in the case in early February, but it has met only rarely since that time. Calheiros, who helped throw the case into the national spotlight by his numerous public condemnations of the military's actions, has not yet been allowed to testify, and the formal defense of the four accused is just now being presented. 2. In the meantime, Thibault was given permission to leave the country and traveled to France on April 29. Officials of the Ministry of Justice have stated that authorization for Thibault's voluntary departure was given by the Brazilian
	government in order to avoid the necessity of deporting him formally at a later date. Thibault will still be tried in absentia, but this appears to be a pro forma gesture. Exempted from Automatic Decontrol.
