The long and costly case was concluded in September, 1952, when the Welfare Department suddenly and unexpectedly withdrew its charges and granted Miss Leinsz a license after withholding it for two years!

Once again, this fine Christian worker was able to resume her work for needy children.

There is little doubt in our minds that this sudden reversal of the Welfare Department was due to fear—fear that certain machinations were about to be exposed to public view in an open hearing in the Circuit Court to which the case had been moved from the Juvenile Court of Chicago.

Social workers of the Juvenile Court and welfare workers of the Welfare Department were to be called as witnesses and questioned openly, **under oath**. Previously, testimony had not been given under oath. It was also known that we intended to subpoena the records of the Department of Public Welfare and the Juvenile Court.

As sudden as the new license was issued to Miss Leinsz, was the notification to Miss Leinsz that the case was dismissed and the public hearing cancelled.

Despite the boldness and audacity of the enemy in its attack upon the Christian testimony and work of this minister of the Gospel, Miss Anna C. Leinsz, God has again proved Himself mighty on behalf of His own.
