K mart executive says: 'Waldenbooks does not nor have they ever sold porn'

Following articles in the *AFA Journal*, K mart says it has pulled six pornographic books from their Waldenbooks stores. K mart Chairman Joseph E. Antonini notified AFA President Donald E. Wildmon on November 29 that Waldenbooks had pulled the pa-

perback porn books mentioned in the AFA articles. AFA had identified the homosexual books *Meat, Wad*, and *Rauch* and also listed *Finishing School*, *That Wicked Summer*, and *Ellen's Story*, books cited by the Clermont County (Ohio) Review as containing child

pornography.

In his letter to Wildmon, Antonini said that "Waldenbooks' buyers made a decision several months ago to stop buying these titles (the books identified as containing child porn), due to a lack

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AFA sues the National Endowment for the Arts top lawyer for slander

Julianne Ross Davis, General Counsel for the National Endowment for the Arts, is being sued by the American Family Association and its executive director Donald E. Wildmon. The lawsuit was filed in the U.S. District Court in Philadelphia.

The suit alleges four claims against Davis: slander, slander per se, intentional infliction of emotional distress, and negligent infliction of emotional distress. It asks for compensatory damages in excess of \$200,000 plus punitive damages.

"It is a very sad day when an individual who is the top lawyer of a major government agency resorts to outright lies to slander an individual and organization critical of the NEA," said Benjamin W. Bull, General

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ACLU director's letter launches attack against AFA because of success

The American Civil Liberties Union, the group which feels that child pornography should be legal, has named AFA as a leading enemy of theirs. In an undated letter, ACLU executive director Ira Glasser wrote: "Arrayed against civil liberties today are powerful groups like the Rev. Donald Wildmon's American Family Association which seeks—with increasing success—to impose its religious and moral beliefs on all Americans."

Nowhere in the letter did Mr. Glasser explain how AFA was seeking to impose its religious and moral beliefs on all Americans.

"Evidently the astounding success of AFA in getting its Law Center organized and involve and the fact that approximate 350 attorneys have volunteered work with the AFA Law Center seen by the ACLU as a threat to their free reign in the courts for the past fifty years," said Donald E.

Wildmon, AFA President.

The ACLU supports legalization of child pornography, legalization of drugs, tax exemption for satanists, legalization of prostitution, abortion on demand, mandatory sex education, forced busing, ideological testing for court appointees and legalization of polygamy.

The ACLU opposes voluntary

school prayer, sobriety checkpoints, tax exemption for churches, educational vouchers and home schooling, parental consent laws, medical safety regulations and reporting, governmental ethics committees, prison terms for criminal offenses, and teaching "monogamous, heterosexual intercourse within marriage" in the public schools.

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
