natural history a ten-day vacation seminar

A holiday workshop carefully planned to combine serious learning and light-hearted diversion, with time for vigorous discussion and care-free leisure — time for swimming, tennis, hiking — for visiting the many attractions in the Berkshires: Tanglewood concerts, theaters in Williamstown and Stockbridge, dance at Jacob's Pillow, and more.
