

Proposal for international day of solidarity with Omori

We are informed by the British D.A.M. that they are planning a demonstration/picket on behalf of Omori in early August at the Japanese Embassy in London, this being the 10th anniversary of his arrest. It should also be noted that this coincides roughly with Hiroshima and Nagasaki Days. We propose that where ever possible, W.S.A local groups should initiate protests at local offices of the Japanese government (or airline offices and other businesses) to coincide with those of the D.A.M., as well as call on like-minded groups and individuals to do the same elsewhere in the U.S. and abroad (D.A.M. already reports interest in some other countries).

A focus for our own protests might not only be the case of Omori, but also a linkage to other struggles of indigenous people (such as Big Mountain), the issue of political prisoners everywhere (the recent success of Amnesty International's rock tour shows this has wide appeal), and opposition to U.S. & Japanese militarism (again the Hiroshima/Nagasaki linkage should be quite striking).

Proposal for creation of International Secretary for W.S.A.

We propose that the function of international correspondence and relations with I.W.A. and other foreign groups be given to an International Secretary who would be elected like other officers and would be a member of the National Committee. This would leave the National Secretary the function of producing a regular Discussion Bulletin, handling correspondence from members and inquiries from non-members.
