

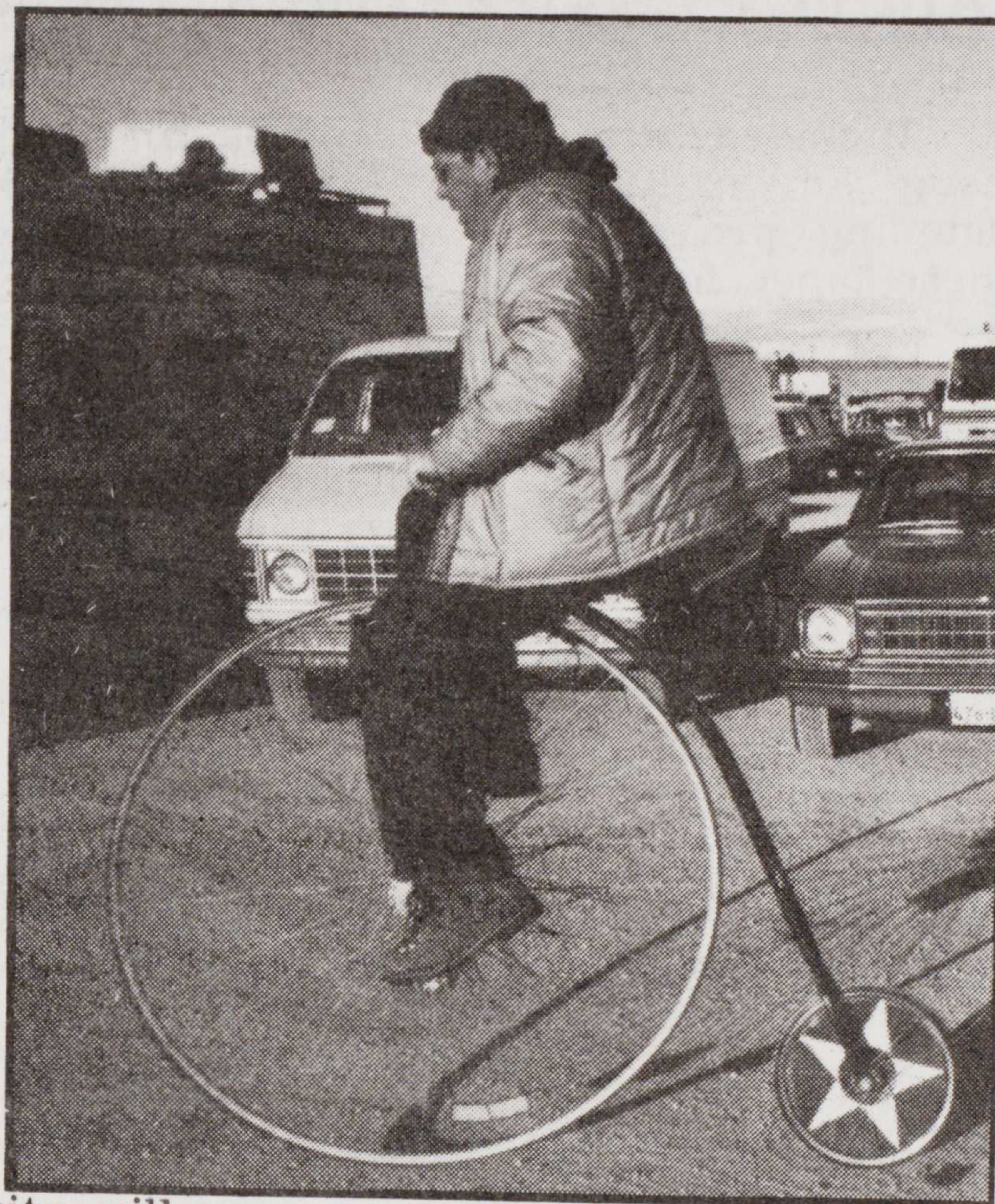
Walter's 7 Challenges
