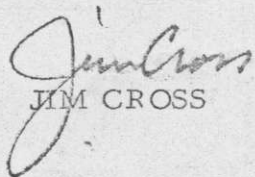
MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRESIDENT

SUBJECT: Eighth Annual Inter-American Air Force Chiefs Conference

The Eighth Annual Inter-American Air Force Chiefs Conference is tentatively scheduled for the period 11-22 May 1968, at three Air Force installations within the United States. Three copies of the recommended agenda and itinerary for the Conference are attached.

Although this Conference is not covered by NSAM 316 you are being informed of it to insure that any implications having a political significance have not been overlooked. This Conference has been coordinated with the Department of State and clearances have been obtained.

It is requested that a protocol call at the White House be arranged for the Air Force Chiefs. The visiting Chiefs traditionally have called upon the Presidents of the host countries at some time during the conference schedule. The U.S. Air Force desires to continue this custom and would like to include a call on President Johnson in the schedule of events in Washington, (11-13 May 1968), if convenient to the President.
