

SUGGESTED WHITE HOUSE STATEMENT

President Castello Branco of Brazil in late December invited President Johnson to visit Brazil. Following the President's State of the Union Message on January 4, the President received invitations from several other Latin American countries. The President is especially anxious to visit Latin America and to talk to the Presidents of these countries. Because it would not be possible to visit all of them, the President suggested to the Brazilian President that he consider inviting the South American Presidents to meet with them at Rio de Janeiro. The Brazilian President agreed and a meeting will take place at Rio de Janeiro April 29-May 1 of the Brazilian and United States Presidents and other South American Presidents who wish to attend. The meeting will be entirely informal without agenda or formal communique at the end of the meeting. Its purpose is to permit the Presidents to exchange views
