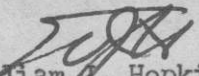

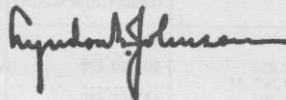

FORTY-FIFTH REPORT TO CONGRESS ON LEND-LEASE OPERATIONS

SUMMARY OF 1963 ACTIVITIES*

Collections during 1963 totaled \$48,754,982.23 of which \$29,180,769.11 was paid on principal and \$19,574,213.12 in interest. This total comprised dollar payments of \$48,343,240.08 and the equivalent of \$411,742.15 in foreign currency. Payments by country are shown below.

The status of the three categories of lend-lease accounts as of December 31, 1963, is summarized hereinafter, followed by tables showing detailed data, by country.

Lend-Lease Funded Settlement Accounts (Tables 3 and 4)

Principal payments and credits totaled \$611,259,090.64 or about 39 percent of the total settlement obligation of \$1,579,141,431.92. In addition, \$326,375,632.68 has been paid as interest on these accounts. A total of \$77,695,174.17 on principal and \$16,659,237.26 in interest is past due.

Lend-Lease Cash Accounts (Table 5)

Payments received and other credits amounted to \$1,301,599,178.14 or about 98 percent of the total repayment obligation of \$1,326,934,982.11. Past due principal payments total \$25,335,803.97.

Lend-Lease Silver Accounts (Table 6)

Of the 409,782,670.64 fine troy ounces of silver loaned to various countries, 384,819,249.64 fine troy ounces have been repaid in kind. Payments in dollars amounted to \$23,969,809.54, the equivalent of 23,003,167.73 fine troy ounces, bringing the combined total to 407,822,417.37 fine troy ounces. The outstanding balance payable amounts to 1,960,253.27 fine troy ounces.

Executive Order 9630, Sept. 27, 1945, terminated FEA and transferred to Department of State, in Part I, par. 2, all lend-lease functions exercised by FEA and its agencies. Lend-lease fiscal responsibilities were transferred to Treasury Department by Executive Order 9726, May 17, 1946.

APPENDIX

INDEX OF LEND-LEASE AND RELATED AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN GOVERNMENTS

The tabulation on the following pages provides an index to lend-lease, reciprocal aid, and related agreements pertinent to the over-all mutual aid programs of World War II.

For each country there are given references to such developments as the date of the declaration by the President of its lend-lease eligibility and the date on which its respective master lend-lease agreement with the United States was signed, together with information about where, if published, it may be found.

Similar data concerned with lend-lease and related settlement agreements are provided.

NOTE.—*Treaties and Other International Acts Series* (TIAS) has replaced the Department of State publications *Treaty Series* (TS) and *Executive Agreement Series* (EAS). The texts printed in the present series, as in the *Treaty Series* and *Executive Agreement Series*, are authentic and, in appropriate cases, are certified by the Department of State. The *Treaties and Other International Acts Series* begins with number 1501, the last number of the *Treaty Series* being 994 and of the *Executive Agreement Series* being 506. The compilation of annual volumes entitled *United States Treaties and Other International Agreements* (cited as UST) is the successor to the *United States Statutes at Large* so far as concerns the texts of treaties and agreements which have been entered into force beginning with the year 1950.

¹ The lend-lease agreements signed by the United States with 18 of the other American Republics differed from the conventional "master" agreements in that a specific repayment responsibility, for defense aid furnished, was accepted by each nation. In some cases, supplementary arrangements were agreed upon by funding the repayment obligations.

² Settlement agreements with some countries covered only lend-lease while agreements with other countries covered such things as lend-lease, surplus property, reciprocal aid, and various claims. This table lists all agreements which in whole or in part pertain to lend-lease settlements.

³ In addition to the listed agreements, the historic document entitled *The Declaration by United Nations* for a cooperative war effort (not to be confused with the *Charter of the United Nations* signed in San Francisco in 1945) originally was signed on Jan. 1, 1942, by representatives of 26 nations and, on later dates, by 19 others. (See *Twenty-first Report to Congress on Lend-Lease Operations*, pp. 44-45, for list of countries.) It confirmed and accepted the principles of the *Atlantic Charter*, a Joint Declaration (Aug. 14, 1941) by the President of the United States and the Prime Minister of the United Kingdom (EAS 233; 55 Stat. 1603).

⁴ Section 3 (c) Agreement was an executive agreement concluded pursuant to sec 3 (c) of the Lend-Lease Act of Mar. 11, 1941, which, as amended, prescribed a period up to July 1, 1949, to carry out an agreement of the United States with another government to furnish supplies and services, provided that the agreement was signed before July 1, 1946.

⁵ Territory under the jurisdiction of the French National Committee was declared eligible to receive lend-lease aid on Nov. 11, 1941, and all French territory not under the control of the Axis was declared eligible on Nov. 13, 1942.

ADDENDUM

Aid was furnished, under special circumstances and specific conditions, to certain countries which never had formally been declared eligible for formal lend-lease treatment. These are Burma (see preceding table), Denmark, Finland, Greenland, Italy, Sweden, and Thailand.

Transfers to Denmark were made pursuant to arrangements described in the *Twenty-first Report to Congress on Lend-Lease Operations*, and those made to Italy were pursuant to arrangements described in the *Twenty-third Report to Congress on Lend-Lease Operations*. In respect to the others named, a *modus operandi*, very similar to that used for lend-lease cash-reimbursement transactions but not under the Lend-Lease Act, was used to help these governments to acquire approved essential goods and services.
