MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRESIDENT

SUBJECT: Appointment for Brazilian President-elect Costa e Silva

I know that you prefer not to have foreign visitors during January, but I am asking you to reconsider the case of Brazilian President-elect Costa e Silva for these reasons:

- It involves only an office appointment and not the full treatment of a state visit.
- He has accepted invitations to visit Western Europe during January and will be passing through the US on his way to Japan in late January.
- He has declined a Soviet invitation and let Ambassador Tuthill know how much he would appreciate an invitation to the United States.
- Maintaining his goodwill after he assumes office on March 15 is of such importance to continued close US-Brazilian cooperation on hemispheric and world issues.

I recommend that you authorize us to extend an invitation to him to visit the US and to call on you at a mutually acceptable date in late January.
