Stevenson told Cleveland he first informed in late November, and that Thant said he had not wanted to talk to him on matter before elections but that he (Thant) had gone ahead on his own. Talk between Secretary and Stevenson on subject.

Secretary told Stevenson we need know U Thant's thinking and what reaction he had had. Possible venues also discussed. told Secretary

Later same day, Stevenson same response was "very affirmative" re opening line of communcation, and that he (Thant) got

this word from the Russians.

Stevenson told Secretary of further conversations with U Thant and indicated would explore the possibility of Rangoon as site for talks. Secretary said for time being it "makes sense for U Thant to keep this (matter) in his own hand for the moment."

After Stevenson said U Thant's source of information was Suslov, Secretary said he wouldn't mind asking Dobrynin "quite frankly about it." (UThant account is that he suggested to Stevenson in November that discussions take place in Rangoon between the American Ambassador and the North Vietnamese Consul General in order that secrecy be maintained. Stevenson was not enthusiastic).

U Thant asked Stevenson about US response and was told it was being given "serious consideration". Stevenson reported foregoing to Secretary. (Thant account is that he did not raise subject with Stevenson until January, and that Stevenson said Washington found it difficult to accept suggestion because of shakiness of South Viet Nam Government.) (Stevenson later told Cleveland that Washington response was always: "There may be a time...but not now.")

February 13, 1965

U Thant told Yost he was still awaiting US response.

February 21, 1965

Los Angeles Times published story headed "Thant Sends Peace
Plan to LBJ" subheaded XXXXX "Stevenson is Likely Intermediary."

February 24

U Thant held press conference. In later telephone discussion with U Thant, Secretary said SYG's "proposals" just procedural and gave no indications that talks would be fruitful.

U Thant said again that he had had no response from Stevenson on his "proposal."

February 27

Stevenson told U Thant that despite existence of several channels of communication, there no indication that Hanoi willing
