(C) SIGNIFICANCE: Reportedly an honest and hard working officer, Gen Cantalice is described by many as not particularly forceful or imaginative. An excellent speaker with an engaging personality, he readily makes friends and accomplishes a great deal through personal contacts. He is greatly influenced by his very attractive, ambitious wife, and much of his success in the past probably can be attributed

to Mrs. Cantalice, a long-time ardent and vocal supporter of former President Juscelino Kubitschek (presidential hopeful of the Social Democratic Party who cooperated with João Goulart, President from 1961 to Apr 1964). He is a pilot: two of his field grade promotions were for merit.

(C/NFD) International: Pro-U.S.; friendly with U.S. personnel in Brazil. While Commandant of the Air Force Academy (1959-1961), he introduced some courses and material used in the U.S. Air Force Academy. Probably anti-Communist.

(C) Internal: A long-time pro-Vargas officer, he is a supporter of Kubitschek, Vargas' successor, and probably of Goulart. He welcomed Kubitschek at the airport upon the latter's return to Brazil on 4 Oct 1965. He was without assignment during the Quadros administration (Jan-Aug 1961). He apparently returned to favor when President Goulart came to power, however, and was given the important command of the 5th Air Zone in Rio Grande do Sul (1961-1963). He was opposed to Leonel Brizzola, pro-Communist and anti-U.S. brother-in-law of President Goulart, and in 1961 warned his troops against the dangers of Communist infiltration in the Air Force.
