Caribbean liveaboard diving

Five dives a day, at some of the Caribbean's best sites

Begins and ends on St. Martin.

Price includes:

- * Seven nights accommodations in air-conditioned cabins on our liveaboard;
- * 5 dives (including night dive) daily;
- * All meals daily, plus between-dive snacks;
- * Friday evening closing-night dinner ashore in St. Martin;
- * Use of tanks, weights and belts;
- * Marine Park diving fees;
- * All alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages, as well as snacks;
- * All Port and Immigration Fees;
- * Airport transfers;
- * All crew gratuities.

Not included:

- * Airfare;
- * Optional activities such as kayaking, island tours, etc.
- * Equipment rental and instruction fees, if requested.

Is this the right trip for you?

You should be a certified scuba diver (or ready to finish certification via a PADI referral), but no other special skills or training are needed to enjoy this week.

The islands of Saba, St. Kitts, and Statia offer some of the Caribbean's best scuba diving sites. Far less visited than resort destinations such as the Bahamas, these unspoiled islands and the reefs around them are best enjoyed from a liveaboard boat. Enjoy up to five dives a day, at depths ranging from 20 to 120 feet. When you're not diving, join new gay friends to explore the colonial forts, fragrant rainforests, and gingerbread villages of these three tiny islands.

Highlights:

- * Dive at Saba's renowned "Eye of the Needle", a coral-encrusted spire rising from the black depths below.
- * Visit the wreck of the MV River Taw, off the beaches of St. Kitts.
- * See an entirely different underwater world each evening on our night dives.
- * Expand your diving skills with PADI advanced or specialty programs such as underwater photography.
- * Meet some of our gay friends on Saba, when we visit this friendly but little-known volcanic island.
- * Between dives, enjoy the boat's extensive library, movie collection, and sundeck.
- * Optional activities include kayaking, rain forest hikes, and horseback rides.
