Why Wages Rise

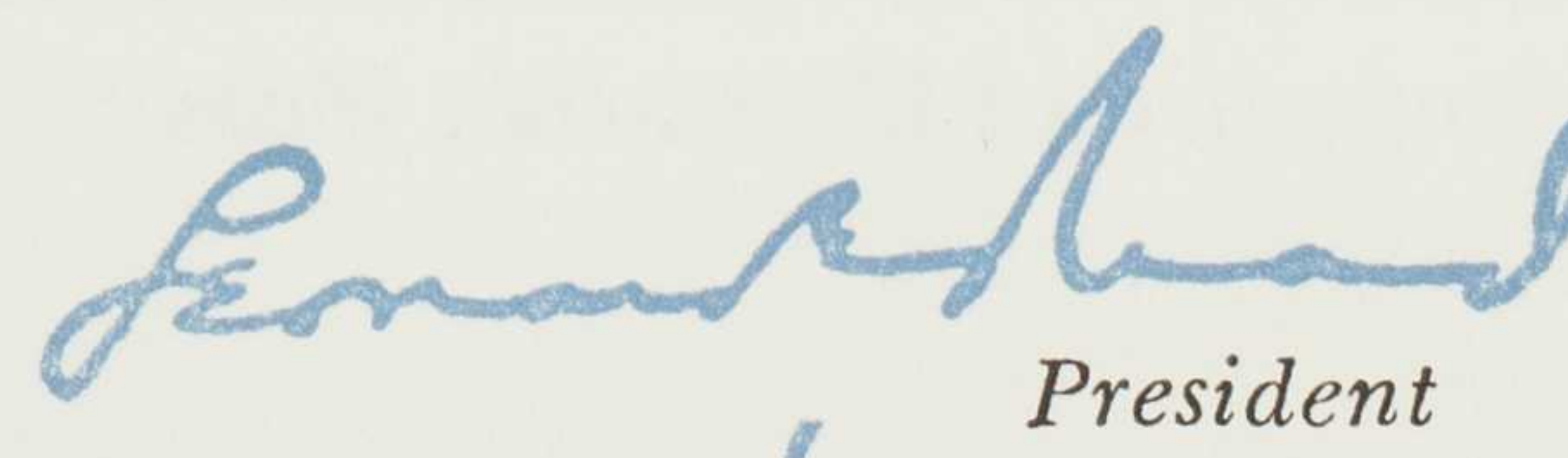
