BRAZIL Gen Augusto FRAGOSO May 1968

- (U) <u>NAME</u>: Gen Augusto <u>Fragoso</u> (frah-GOH-soh), Army.
- (U) POSITION: Commandant, Superior War School, since Mar 1967.
- (C) SIGNFICANCE: An intelligent, and capable officer (can perform efficiently when necessary), he lacks drive and assurance, choosing the easy solution. Although he is loyal to the government and to the revolution, many hardline officers disapprove of his neutral stand prior to the Mar-Apr 1964 revolution and resent his promotion (by then President João Goulart) to Maj Gen ahead of more senior officers. He was



Maj Gen ahead of more senior officers. He was a close personal friend of the late Marshal (Ret) Humberto Castello Branco (President from 1964-1967), with whom he served in the Brazilian Expeditionary Forces in Italy in World War II. He is being considered for the U.S. Legion of Merit (Officer).

(C/NFD) POLITICS:

(C/NFD) International: He has a broad international outlook and is oriented toward the West. Generally friendly toward the United States, he was very cooperative with U.S. forces in Italy during World War II and was well liked during his tour as Assistant Military Attaché in the U.S. (1948-1950).

(C) Internal: A political moderate, he has no known political affiliation, and is reluctant to talk politics. He is very close to Marshal (Ret) Henrique Teixeira Lott (influential former Minister of War whose strongly legalistic orientation played a major role in frustrating efforts to exclude Juscelino Kubitschek and João Goulart from the Presidency).

(C) PERSONAL DATA:

- (U) Birth: 26 Nov 1908 in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.
- (U) Family: Wife, Idalina Fragoso (quiet and retiring). Children: two married daughters. A brother, Aloisio Fragoso, is a medical doctor.



Generally presents a neat appearance. Likeable and pleasant, but quiet, mild almost to the point of timidity, formal is manner; solemn, humorless; apt to resent imagined slights. Instellectural, enjoys reading history. Drinks only soft drinks. Will respond positively only if pressed.

- (U) Languages: Native Portugese, fluent Spanish, fair English and French, limited Italian.
