(U) <u>NAME</u>: Vice Adm João Baptista Francisconi Serran (sehr-RAHN), Navy.

(U) POSITION: Director General of Hydrography and Navigation, since about Feb 1967.

(C) <u>SIGNIFICANCE</u>: Adm Serran has good leadership qualities and is an excellent officer with a strong, positive character. Professionally well qualified, he has held important command and staff positions.

(C) International: Pro-U.S. and anti-Communist.

(C) Internal: Reportedly greatly interested in Brazilian politics, firmly believes that Brazil must not be allowed to fall into the hands of corrupt politicians, as it had prior to the military revolution in Apr 1964 that ousted leftist-tending President João Goulart and brought the government of Marshal Humberto Castello Branco into power. He was dismissed from the Navy for his involvement in the May 1938 almost successful coup against President Getúlio Vargas by the fascist Integralists, but was reinstated in 1947 along with other naval personnel involved in the uprising.




