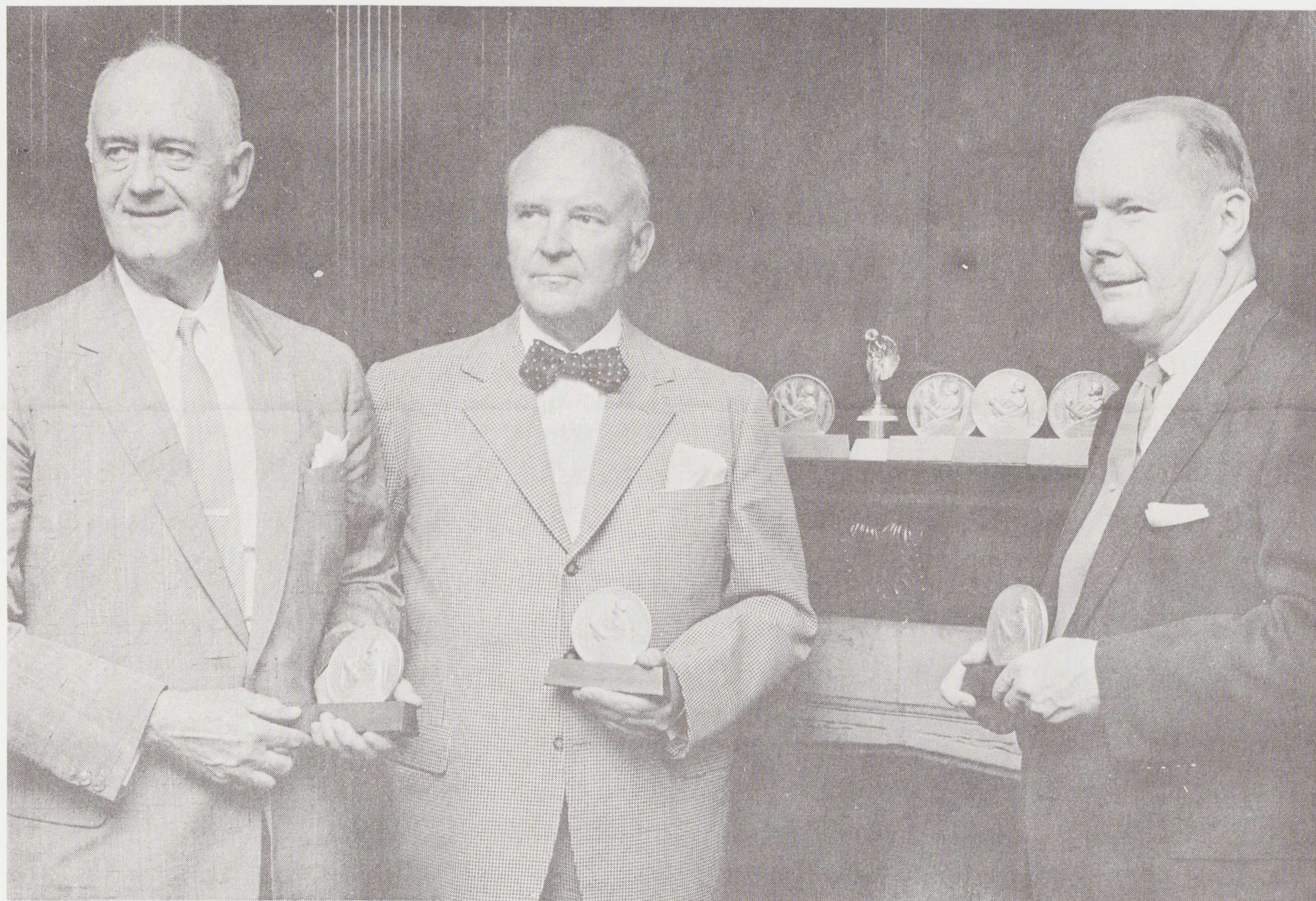


CLARK AND RIMANOCZY AWARDED MEDALS FROM
FREEDOMS FOUNDATION OF VALLEY FORGE

The George Washington Gold Medals were presented today to Fred G. Clark, founder and Richard S. Rimanoczy, Editorial Director, of The American Economic Foundation, by Admiral Felix B. Stump, U.S.N. (Ret.), Vice Chairman of Freedoms Foundation, in recognition of their production of a children's pictorial history of the economic growth of America.

Appearing as a series throughout 1958 in "Boys' Life", the official magazine of the Boy Scouts of America, the story entitled "How America Grew" was the first successful attempt to explain basic economic principles to boys and girls of pre-high school age. In fact, the results were so encouraging that The American Economic Foundation has been persuaded by teachers in elementary schools to prepare a course in simple economics for use at that age level. Work has already begun with a view toward conducting field research during the next school year.
