- 3) Admiral Lucio Meira is still President of Companhia Siderurgica Nacional, and Dr. Eliezer Batista da Silva still remains as President of Cia. Vale do Rio Doce, the State-owned steel and iron-mining companies, respectively.
- 4) No changes in the National Department of Mineral Production (DNPM) and none indicated; Dr. Irnack Carvalho do Amaral remains Director General.
- 5) No immediate change in the National Coal Plan administration.
- 6) Dr. Marcelo Damy de Souza Santos continues as head of the National Nuclear Energy Commission.
- 7) Cia. de Mineração Novalimense's (Hanna) case in the Supreme Court is still pending. The company continues to mine and ship ore at approximately 400,000 tons per year rate. Its capacity is greater, but the problem remains one of shipment over the Central Railroad.
