			"Mr. Peffau added that France has uranium deposits and that Brazil also should have them within, at least, two years. (Embassy comment: this may be a misquote: uranium deposits either exist or they do not. This may be a garbled reference to the possibility that hitherto unknown deposits may be discovered.)
			"'In order for the two countries to do business in uranium', he continued, 'a commercial agreement in this field is necessary, but no such agreement exists yet'.
			"He said further that the agreement between Brazil and France for cooperation in the fiel MERATOMALIZER AREAS rgy dates from May of 1962, and covers technical cooperation only.
