

faithful and God's friend. (Isa. 41:8 and Jas. 2:23) I accept the words of the Jewish Messiah and I love His words. I do not reject them. This makes me a complete Jew. Rabbi Nuri is not a rabbi chosen by God; the Rabbi selected his vocation himself. But I was called by God himself, the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, as was Moses and all other true Jewish prophets.

About the only true statement that I read in the article that the Jewish Rabbi Nuri made was, "Jewish tradition has never tried to force people to convert to Judaism." We force no one either. The Rabbi says he can accept the differences of the people. The God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob says to only accept him; all else is idolatry which God hates. When God turned to the Goyim, as He told the Jews He would, He said in the end-times he would turn to a remnant of the Jews because the gentiles would pervert His Word (and they did). As did the Jews of old, so does Rabbi Nuri today. God's Word plainly states, "Without holiness no man shall see God."
