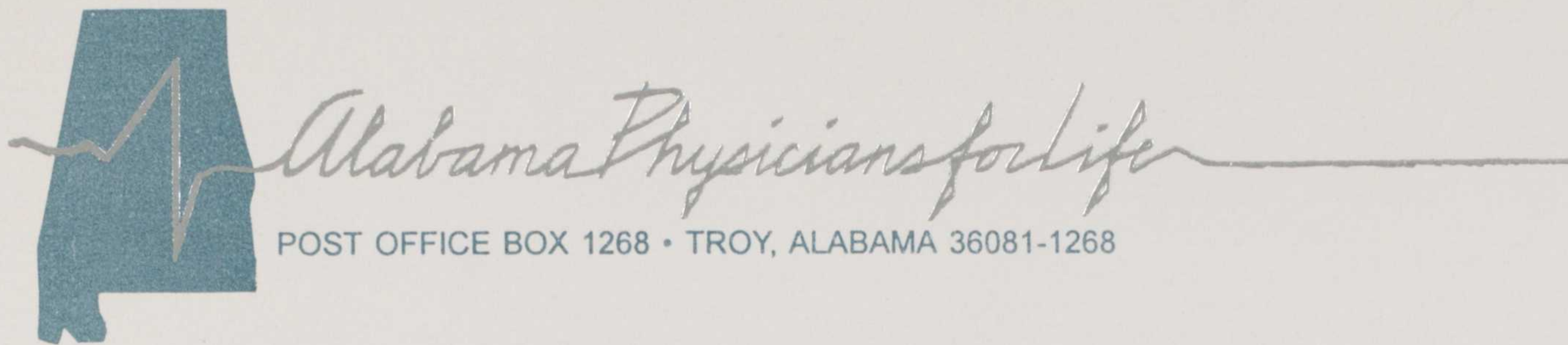

Thank you for your letter of 28 November 98. I appreciate your interest in Alabama Physicians For Life, Inc. (APFLI), our work, and the entire issue of life!

Apparently, you have heard of our newsprint digest, *It's A Matter Of Life*, but you have not actually seen it. You requested "just as wide a sampling as possible of descriptive literature" that APFLI has issued. Please find enclosed copies of our digest and our brochures. *It's A Matter Of Life* has been distributed since 1993, as a newspaper insert and, since 1994, as a direct mail piece. Over 1.3 total pieces have been distributed in Alabama and Georgia. We have distributed over seventy thousand brochures, to individuals and pregnancy centers nationwide. We welcome your comments regarding our materials.

In addition, please find enclosed other materials which may help to inform and strengthen your "Life View". When I first began moving to action years ago, I felt ignorant about the issues and medical information. As I read and watched more, I became increasingly aware that the taking of any human life is inherently wrong because it diminishes the value of every other human life. "Life is like an arch. Discard one segment as worthless and the span collapses, the value of all life brought low." [author unknown] Abortion supporters generally recognize that abortion takes a human life; the key issue is the value of that life...
