

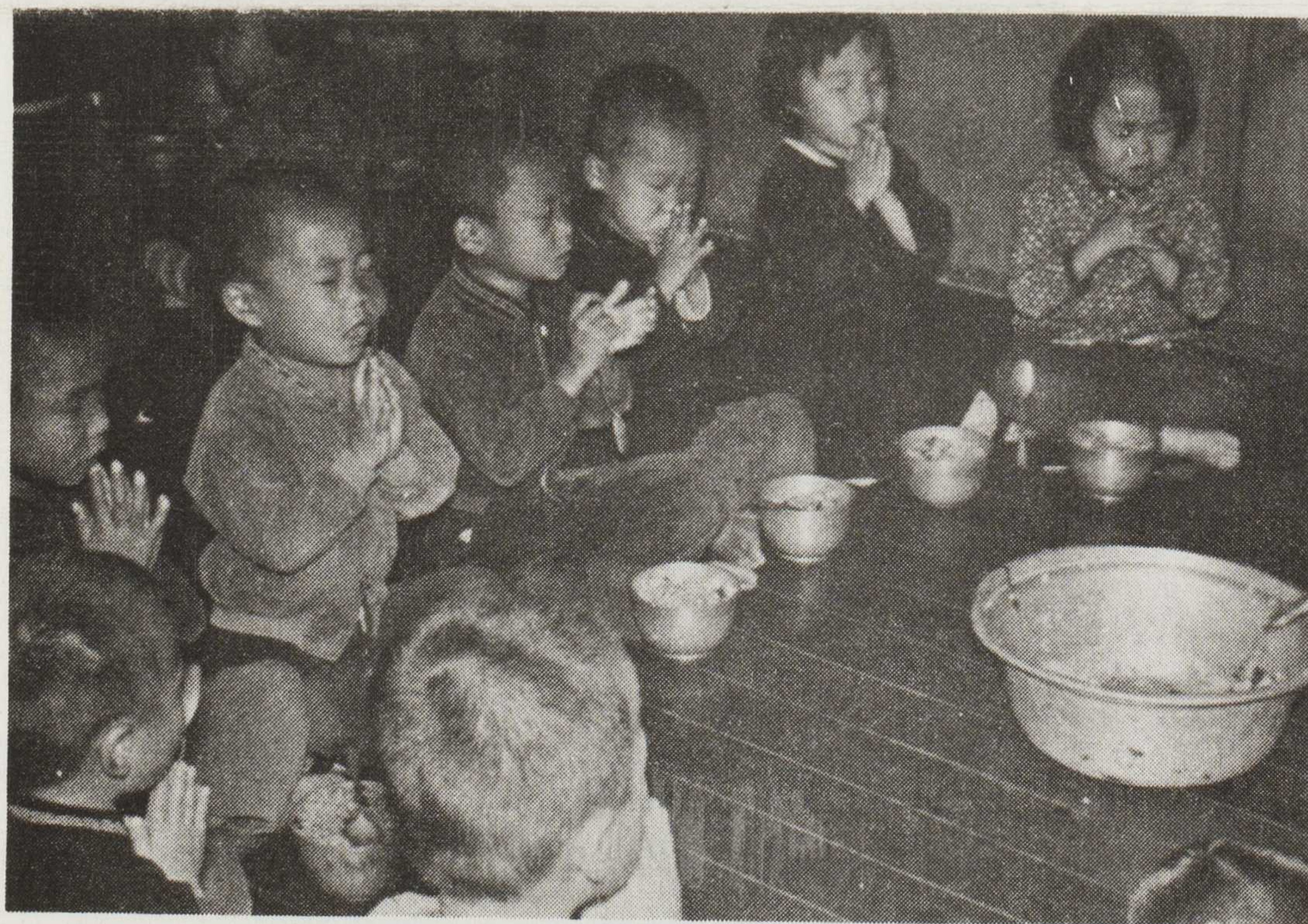
20TH CENTURY REFORMATION HOUR

My dear Radio Listener:

I have just gotten back from Korea. I hasten to get this word to you and to re-emphasize the urgent need and the glory of this great appeal which God has enabled us to make now for nine years. As of today we have received exactly \$19,807.15. One year ago today we had exactly \$19,862.92. But our problem, beloved, is that this year we are asking for \$100,000 more than we got last year—that is, \$400,000 is the goal. So we are going to have to have new listeners, new friends, new supporters, and those of us who have given must continue to be faithful and increase our gift. We have more than 1,000 orphans, six theological seminaries with 600 young men training to preach Christ and Him crucified. We are helping 50 chaplains in the ROK army; last year it was 32. These men refused to be a part of the World Council of Churches. All of these groups have separated; they have sacrificed; they have suffered; they are standing for Christ and we have come in to pick them up and help them. These chaplains last year held 7,172 services in which they preached the salvation message to soldiers. My, the fruit of this will abide for all eternity. We picked up these little lepers. We have two leprosy colonies that we are helping. Those in charge left the World Council of Churches and will have nothing to do with this great apostasy. But Korea is a land of sorrow and heartbreak. To receive \$100,000 more than the \$300,000 last year places a greater burden upon us all, but out there in that land of Korea all these different groups are standing—Baptist, Presbyterian, Methodist, Church of God, Holiness, Independent. We have distributed this past year literally thousands of pieces of literature, Gospel tracts. Our headquarters office in Seoul is the center of all manner of activity with pastors and church leaders coming from all sections for the material that we are getting out. There is a reformation. And then, of course, all that we are doing there has expanded into Formosa, Saigon, India, Africa, South America, Hong Kong—all these areas in those nine years have those in them who in their poverty are rich and who by their faith have looked to God.

I believe that God is using us to answer their prayers and to help them give their blessed testimony to our Saviour. God has said He will not cast off His people, neither will He forsake His inheritance.



There will be a blessing for you, a special blessing for you, as God has promised, if you will help us—\$10 a month, if you cannot give the entire amount at the present, will take care of an orphan. The Apostle said we must "be forward" of that of "a year ago."

Again, may I say that the Federal Communications Commission is involved in all of this.
