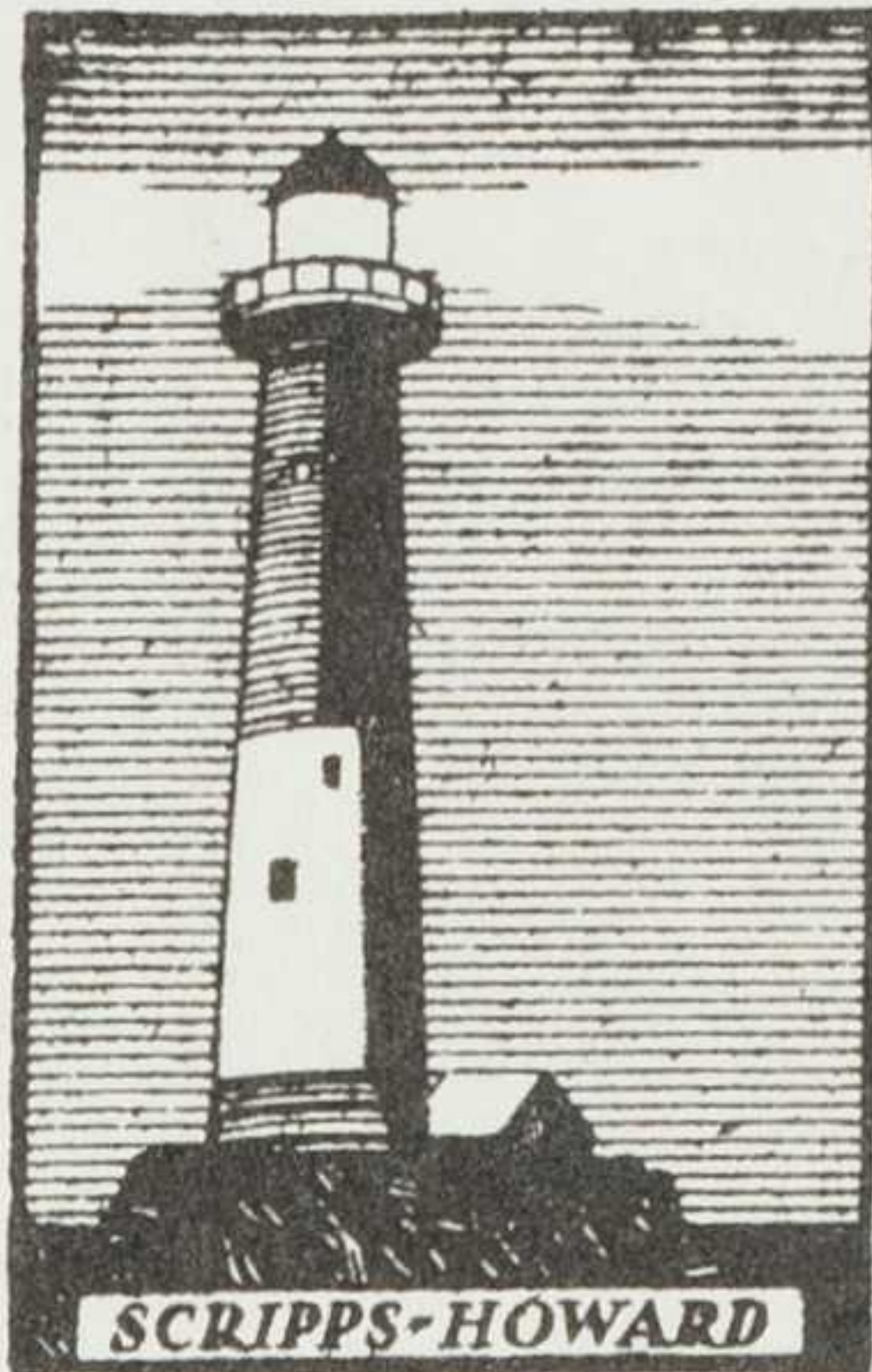

Mrs Roosevelt Doubtful on Bonn

LONG BEACH, Calif., Dec. 13. — "It terrifies me" says Eleanor Roosevelt, "to think we might give nuclear arms to Germany."

The widow of President Franklin D. Roosevelt told Long Beach's Temple Israel Kahn-Guggenheim Forum last night:

"We have built her (West Germany) economically. But 80 percent of her officials are ex-Nazis. But they never admit they were.

"They say none of them liked Hitler. But every day people (in Berlin) go over to that now-empty bunker (where Hitler died) and stand. But for what reason? Honor?

"I have the feeling we don't want to encourage a military power in Central Europe."

Mrs. Roosevelt made her remarks during a question-and-answer session at the end of a formal speech.
