Hallowed be thy Name.	I will extol thee, my God, O king: and I will bless thy name for ever and ever. My mouth shall speak the praise of the Lord: and let all flesh bless his holy name for ever and ever.
Thy Kingdom come.	They shall speak of the glory of thy kingdom and talk of thy power: To make known to the sons of men his mighty acts and the glorious majesty of his kingdom.
Thy will be done on earth.	He will fulfill the desire of them that fear him but all the wicked will he destroy.
Give us this day our daily bread.	The eyes of all wait upon thee: and thou givest them their meat in due season. Thou openest thine hand and satisfiest the desire of every living thing.
Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.	The Lord upholdeth all that fall down and raiseth up all those that be bowed down. The Lord is nigh unto all them that call upon him, to all that call upon him in truth. He will also hear their cry and will save them. The Lord preserveth all them that love him.
For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever.	Thy kingdom is an everlasting kingdom and thy dominion endureth throughout all generations.

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
