

REGIONAL FORUMS, sponsored by the National Women's Political Caucus and the Women's Education Fund of Washington, Seattle, Washington, \$1500.

This project's goal is the formation of a strong two-way communication network with women and women's organizations throughout Washington state. This network will inform women of the laws, rights and services which are available to them and learn from them the unmet needs and problems which face Washington women. The ATR grant of \$1500 will help this group conduct forums to reach a variety of Washington women including those who do not necessarily identify with the women's movement. The issues and concerns identified by this network will be distributed to Washington Women United and other women's groups for their response and action.

SEATTLE WORKING WOMEN, sponsored by the Working Women Organization Project, Cleveland, Ohio, \$3000.

This \$3000 is the second part of ATR's award to the Seattle Working Women's project. Since receiving the first part of the award last Fall, the Seattle Working Women's group has formed a strong and effective organization which is beginning to organize secretaries and clerical workers around issues of discrimination and job conditions. The group has surveyed Seattle clerical workers, issued the results at a public meeting and is currently working on specific issues of discrimination and employment concerns.

MISCELLANEOUS

NORTHWEST IMMIGRATION ALLIANCE PROJECT, sponsored by the Foundation for Chicano Education, Grandview, Washington, \$500.

The Northwest Immigration Alliance (NIA) project works with undocumented workers in the Yakima Valley to inform them of their rights and advise them of immigration procedures. NIA acts as a link between the undocumented worker and the services/assistance they require. NIA is also dedicated to improving the treatment that undocumented workers receive from government and their employers, explaining their concerns to the communities in which the workers stay, and promoting cooperation between the workers and the services provided by Evergreen Legal Services. This \$500 grant is for general support of these efforts and will be accompanied by technical services provided by ATR in support of NIA's activities.

ORGANIZING PROJECT, sponsored by the Alaska Cannery Workers Association, Seattle, Washington, \$4960.

The Alaska Cannery Workers Association (ACWA) is an organization of cannery workers employed in the Alaska seafood processing industry. ACWA's purpose is to alleviate discriminatory working and living conditions and to improve employment opportunities for minority and women workers; to improve wages, working and living conditions for seafood workers as a whole; and to organize cannery workers for these purposes. This \$4960 grant will be used for organizing efforts in Alaska during the 1979 season. Activities will also include any follow-up work that is necessary in conjunction with ACWA's employment discrimination lawsuits against the New England Fish Company (NEFCO), one of the largest Alaska salmon canneries.
