

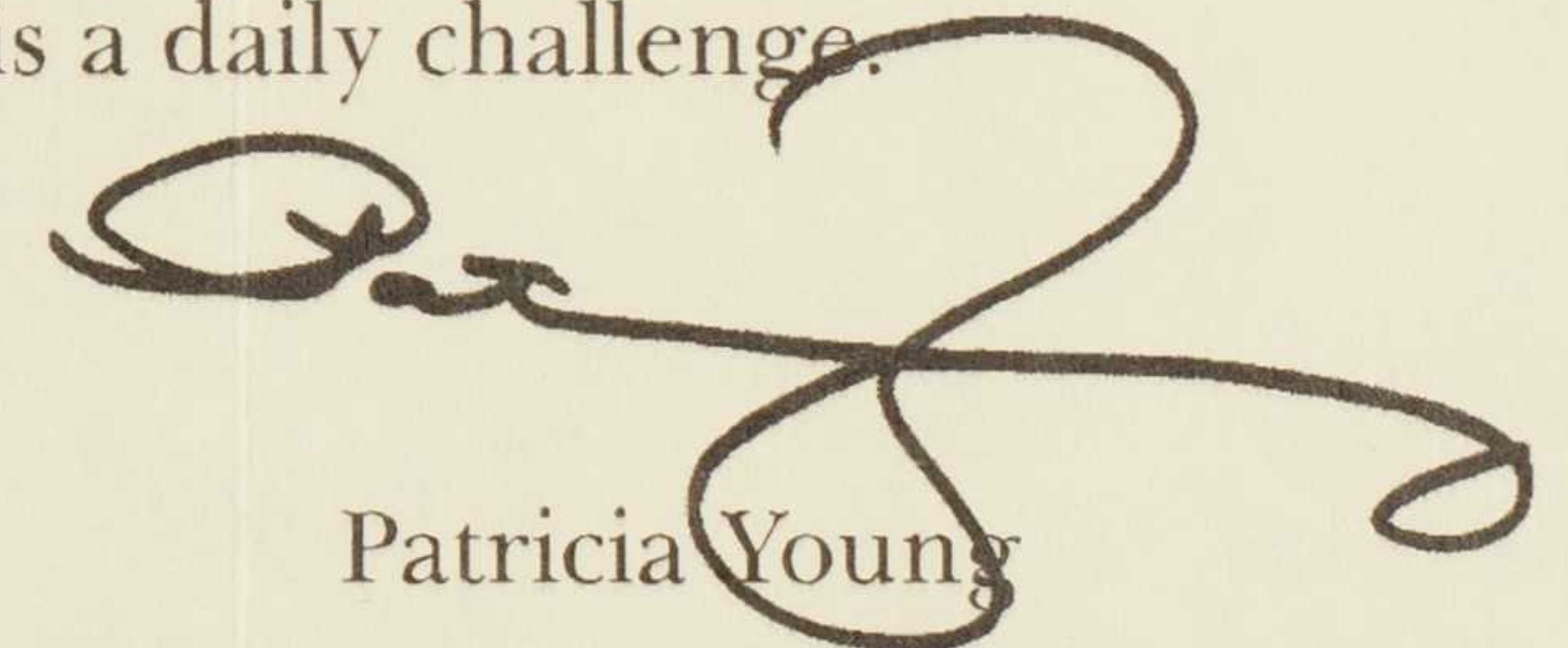
One of the most sustaining images of American life on the prairie was the barn-raising tradition...neighbors helping neighbors.
