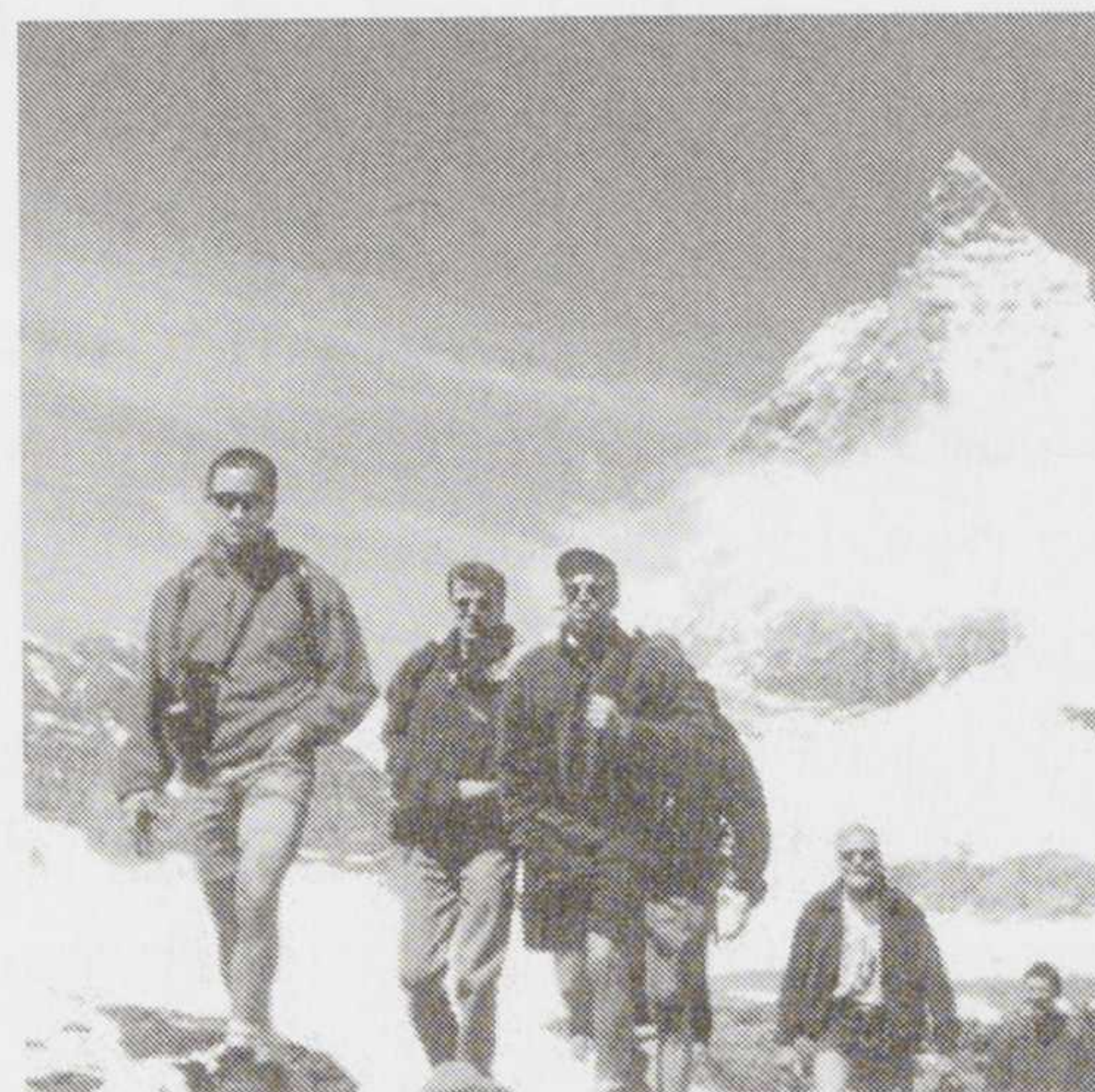
Hike in Alpine splendor. . . .

Edelweiss

Discover a world of wildflowers, waterfalls, and glaciers

Nestled below Switzerland's soaring Matterhorn lies the alpine village of Zermatt, with 388 kilometers of unforgettable hiking trails. 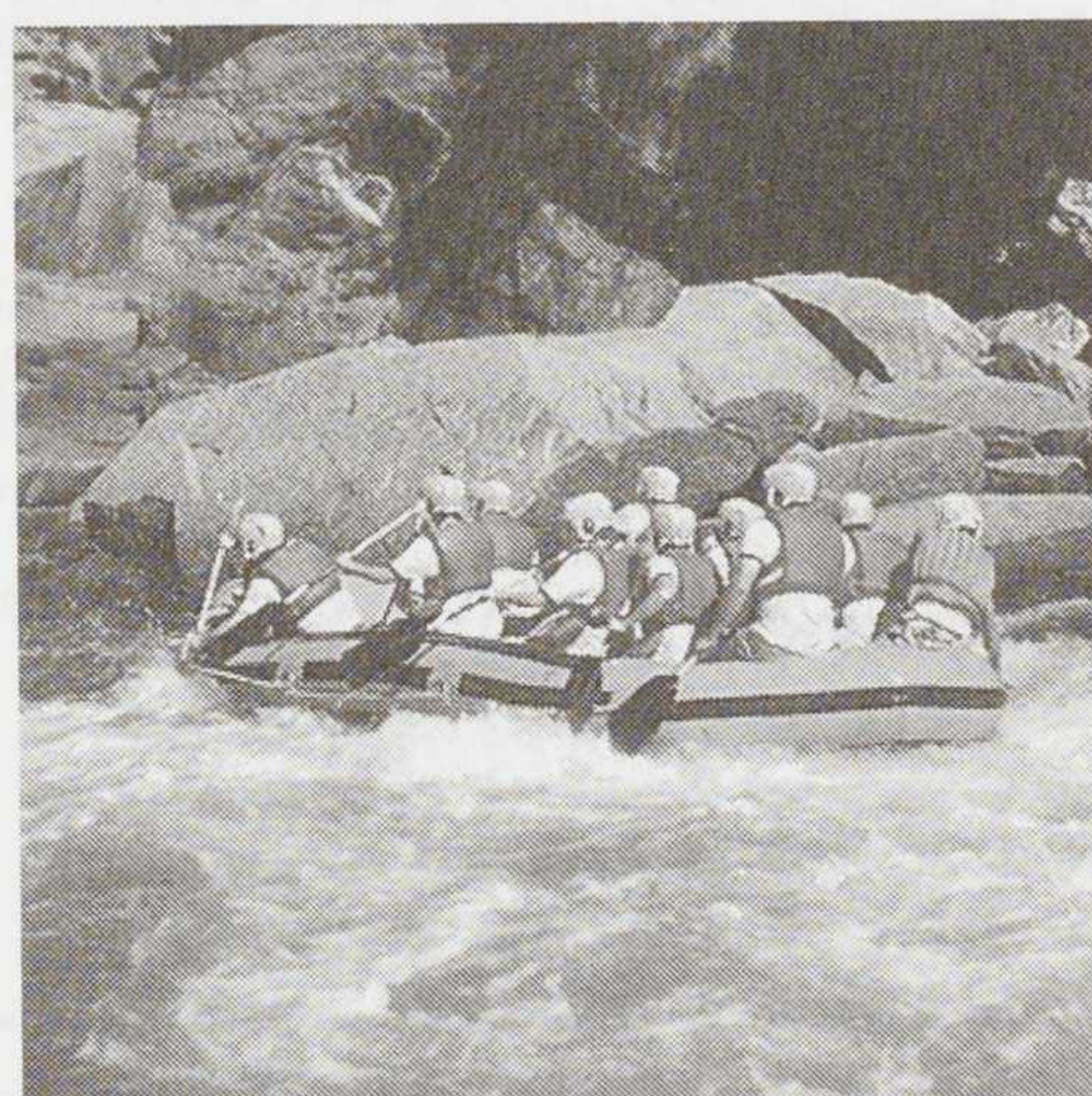
Butch Cassidy Days

The Natchez Trace

Antebellum mansions and Indian mounds

No road in America carries as much history as the Natchez Trace. Carved out 8000 years ago by deer, it was later trod by Choctaw Indians, Mississippi boatmen, outlaws, itinerant preachers, and Civil War troops. Today the gracefully landscaped Trace is a cyclist's paradise. We'll start by retracing the route of a vast Confederate army during the battle of Vicksburg. Then we head to Port Gibson, the town that Ulysses S. Grant called "too pretty to burn," and Natchez, a site first settled by mound-building Indians that still feels much as it did when traders on the Mississippi used it for their base.

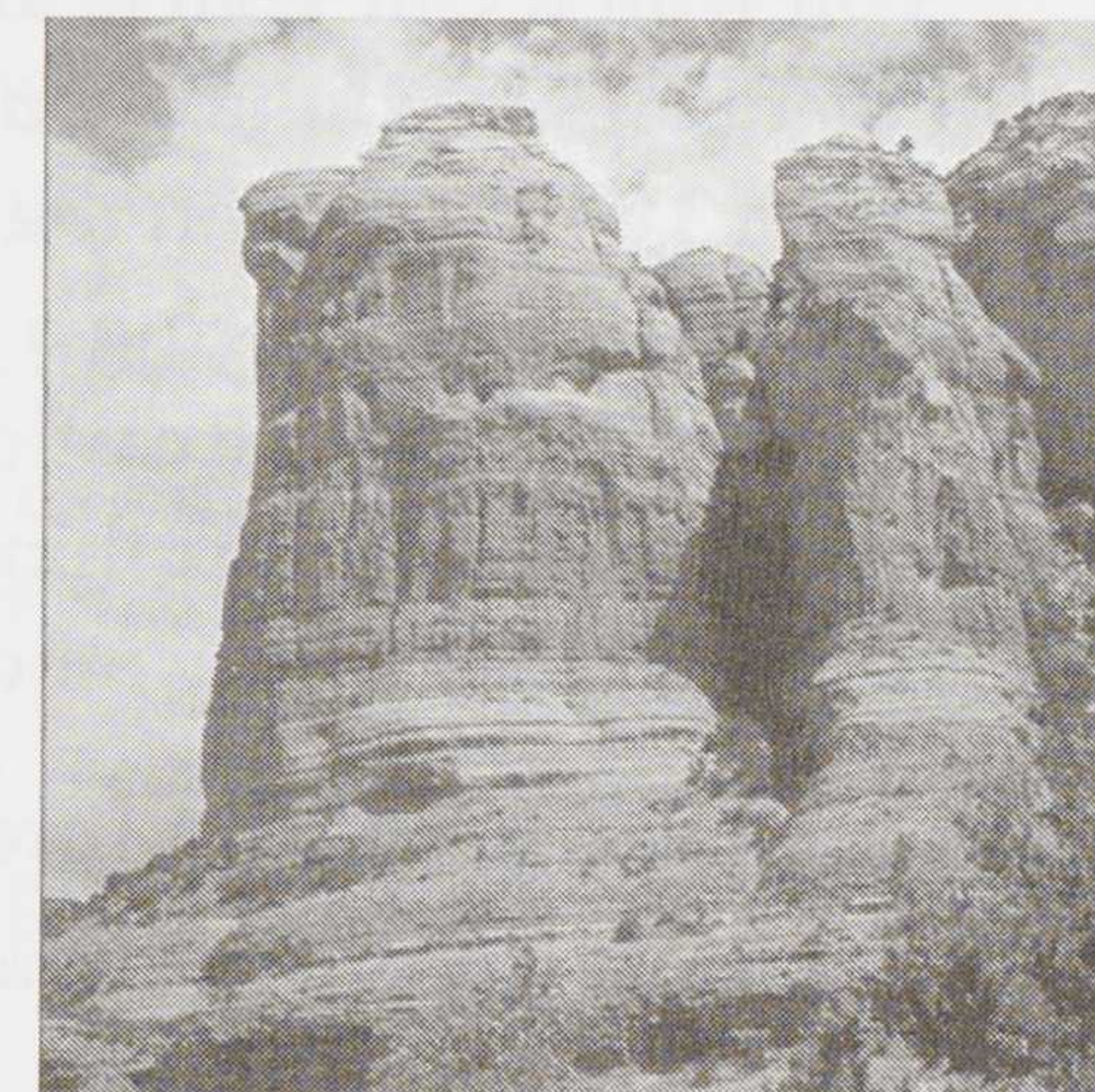
