

of the party a vowed to carry out all of Rockwell's evil plans. Recently they opened a new headquarters at 2507 North Franklin Road in Arlington, Virginia after leaving the ramshackle barrack headquarters they had been using. In addition to the main HQ in Arlington they have regional headquarters in Chicago, Los Angeles, Dallas and a printing plant at Spotsylvania, Va. The NSWPP is organized on a military basis with ranks beginning "Probationary Stormtrooper" all the way up to "Colonel". They wear khaki army type uniforms with black boots and black tie and belt plus the inevitable swastika armband.

National Renaissance Party

This New York City based Nazi party has been in existence for about 20 years. Its long time leader is James H. Madole some times referred to as the "Fuehrer of Yorkville (the German section of New York City)". The NRP has been the only neo-Nazi party to hold street rallies in this city since the end of the war. The official NRP publication is 'National Renaissance Bulletin' published on a monthly basis with frequent lapse in issuance.

The party has a uniform stormtrooper section the Security Echelon (SE) wearing traditional khaki outfits with a lightning emblazoned armband. The runic letter s similar to a bolt of lightning is the NRP symbol, also used by the vicious Nazi Schutzstaffel (SS). A few years ago several members of this hate group were arrested, charged with "criminal anarchy" and a large cache of weapons was confiscated.

In July 1967 the New York Supreme Court recognized the NRP as a legitimate political body with both the right to pursue ballot status and the right to utilize public buildings for meetings. They took quick advantage of this by holding a meeting a PS 169 in the heart of Yorkville.

National States Rights Party

This Southern based and Southern oriented neo-Nazi party's projected ideological image is something between Ku Klux Klan, deep South Bible beltism coupled with cloaked and sometimes blatant neo-Nazism, topped off with a semi-respectable States Rights label. The headquarters of the NSRP is in Savannah, Georgia; formerly the HQ was in Birmingham, Alabama then to Augusta, Georgia. The leader of the NSRP is one Dr. Edward R. Fields who bears the title Director. Other prominent leaders include Ned Dupes as Chairman and J.B. Stoner as Vice-Chairman.

The NSRP's newspaper the 'Thunderbolt' has been characterized as the American counterpart to Julius Streicher's infamous hate sheet 'Der Stürmer'. This is an interesting observation when we consider the fact that the NSRP reprinted the entire May 1934 issue of 'Der Stürmer' devoted to the lie of "Jewish ritual murder". Recently the NSRP has channeled its energy primarily towards production of their newspaper the 'Thunderbolt'; accordingly, street activity and rallies have become less frequent.

The emblem of this vicious hate group is a thunderbolt--the similarity to the Nazi SS symbol is more than obvious.

Other Neo-Nazi Parties

Since the end of the Third Reich neo-Nazi parties have sporadically appeared and most disappeared. Only three have displayed any tenacity: NATIONAL STATES RIGHTS PARTY, NATIONAL RENAISSANCE PARTY, and NATIONAL SOCIALIST WHITE PEOPLES PARTY (AMERICAN NAZI PARTY). Other groups, primarily dissident elements from the above three parties, have formed their own organizations. Most of these splinter groups have folded within a short time or exist only on paper.

The AMERICAN NAZI PARTY seems to be the one most plagued with splinterism. They viewed with disdain the forming of the AMERICAN NATIONAL PARTY, now defunct; the WHITE PARTY, exists only on paper; and more recently, a ludicrous band of bigots in California who enjoy parading in old German uniforms have insisted that they are the true heirs to Rockwell's AMERICAN NAZI PARTY.

The NATIONAL STATES RIGHTS PARTY had its troubles when a portion of their more
