Hooray for the Supreme Court

The U.S. Supreme Court has finally lined up with our traditional view of the First Amendment to the Constitution granting free exercise of religion. In a case from Nebraska, the High Court ruled 8-1 that student prayer groups could pray and worship in public school buildings, thus upholding the Equal Access Act passed by Congress in 1984.

The High Court said that religious groups have as much right to meet for prayer and worship as the Scuba Diving Club has to use the public facilities for their meetings, or the same rights as all other school organizations.

The Court also said that religious groups must not be discriminated against because of their political or religious beliefs.

This is a momentous decision and has widespread ramifications. For instance, study groups can organize meetings to discuss Creation/evolution, invite their friends to attend, choose a qualified Creationist teacher and ask him/her to present the scientific information that points to Creation to the young people present.

I believe that such meetings will be quite popular with the students.

Let me urge you to be on the alert to these Christian groups that will be springing up all across our land when school resumes this fall.

This truly is another great opportunity for us!

We want to be prepared and ready to make good Creationist materials available to any of these groups that request those materials from us.
