Friends of Bayard Rustin High School for the Humanities

Last October a small collection of Rustin memorabilia was donated to the library at the high school bearing his name. Photographic enlargements, several pieces of African art, and a sample of articles were included. A ceremony which included remarks by Executive Director Walter Naegle and Borough President Ruth Messinger as well as a performance by the high school chorale was attended by approximately 50 parents and neighborhood residents.

Ethnic Heritage Day: The Friends of Bayard Rustin H.S. purchased buttons bearing Mr. Rustin's image for distribution to all students on Ethnic Heritage Day. A poster contest and an essay/public speaking contest were sponsored by the Friends, who provided funds for the purchase of awards for each winner.
