

Area, in Brooklyn, New York; and serving for about two years at the Naval Air Station, Corpus Christi, Texas; (All of the Naval Chaplain service was with the ecclesiastical endorsement of the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches through the American Council of Christian Churches); was called, while on active naval duty, as Pastor of the Immanuel Baptist Church of Newton, Massachusetts, serving from March 15 through October 29, 1961; founded, and has been Pastor of Faith Baptist Church in Newton, Massachusetts, from November 5, 1961 to April, 1965, and continues as its radio pastor and missionary. The church is affiliated with the North East Bible Baptist Fellowship, the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches, the American Council of Christian Churches, and the International Council of Christian Churches.

While pastor in the Boston area, Dr. Waite challenged National Council leaders to debate, appeared on many Boston radio programs exposing the apostasy in the National Council of Churches, held public rallies exposing communism and was active in civic affairs. He ran for the Newton school committee on the platform of restoring daily Bible reading to our public schools which received nationwide coverage. He was also active in sponsoring radio rallies for Dr. McIntire in the Boston area.
