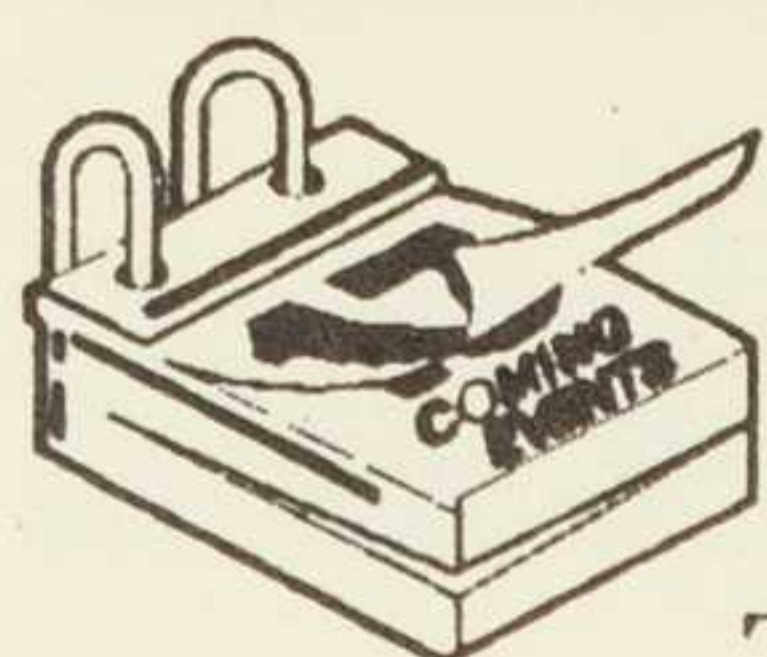




## Save These Dates!!

### Foundation's Tenth Anniversary - January 1995

The Alice Paul Centennial Foundation was created to celebrate Alice Paul's 100th birthday in January 1985. In the past ten years, the board and the members of the Foundation have achieved a number of successes. The most significant include purchasing Alice Paul's books, papers and memorabilia at auction and sharing them with the Smithsonian Institution's National Museum of American History and the Arthur and Elizabeth Schlesinger Library on the History of Women in America at Radcliffe College; purchasing Paulsdale, Alice's birthplace and only remaining home and obtaining National Historic Landmark status for it; establishing a plan that will result in Paulsdale being restored and dedicated as a national leadership and training center for women and girls.

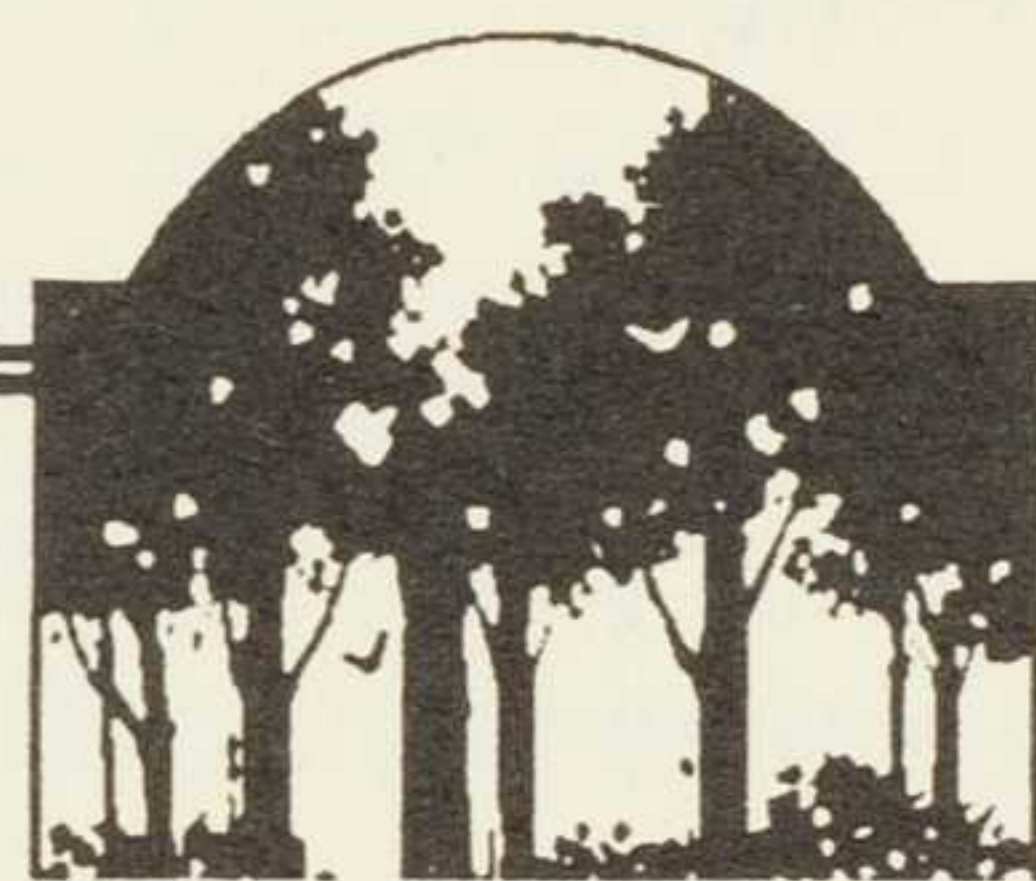

### Amelia Roberts Fry Donates Alice Paul's Bookcase to Foundation

Amelia Fry, Alice Paul's biographer, recently donated one of Alice Paul's bookcases to the Foundation. Ms. Fry acquired this historic piece of furniture in 1985 at a Bryn Mawr Trust auction of the estate of Donald Paul, Dr. Paul's nephew and guardian. In order to obtain the bookcase, which existed as several pieces of unassembled wood, Ms. Fry had to bid against furniture restorers looking for wood as repair pieces. Luckily, she had the winning bid. And luckier for the Foundation to receive such a generous gift, now located at Paulsdale.
